ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to a proposed amendment of Article V, Section 560, King County Charter, concerning Political Activities of County Employees, submitting same to the voters of the County and establishing date of election.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of King County for their approval and ratification or rejection, at the next general election to be held in this county, an amendment to Article V, Section 560 of the King County Charter:

AMENDING Section 560 to read as follows:

560 POLITICAL ACTIVITEES

The-county-administrative-officer; -the-chief-officer-of-each administrative-office-and-executive-department-except-the-department-of-assessments,-the-officers-and-employees-of-each-administrative-office-and-executive-department-except-the-department-of assessments-who-are-not-members-of-the-career-service-and-all members-of-the-career-service-shall-not-engage-in-any-political activity-on-behalf-of,-and-shall-not-pay-or-be asked-to-pay-any assessment-or-contribution-which-will-benefit-directly-orindirectly-anyone-occupying-or-seeking-appointment, nomination or election-to-any-county-office.

The political activities of county employees and offices shall be governed by the applicable provisions of state law. A member of the career service may file for a compensated elective office but he shall take and be granted leave of absence until the date of the election. and-until-his-term-of-office-expires-if-he-is elected.
