AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of South 204th Street V-1549
Petitioner: Charles N. Anderson and others

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of South 204th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 3. The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and were advised that easements are not required.
- 4. The vacation area is a portion of a 40 foot right of way which was deeded to King County by Thomas Synder on November 10, 1903, over which the traffic of the Allen Clark County Road No. 665 predominately traveled. The deed was in exchange for the vacation of an unused portion of the road that same year.
- 5. A search of the records by the Department of Public Works indicate that the County has spent no funds for the acquisition or maintenance of the vacation area. Right of way would therefore be classified "C Class" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 6. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believe that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the day of september, 19 11.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF KING:

SECTION 1. The Council on the <u>Monday</u> day of <u>September</u>, 19 <u>71</u>, hereby vacates and abandons the portion of South 204th Street, described as follows:

lying northerly of a strip of land 60 feet wide lying 30 feet on each side of the following described centerline: Beginning at the southwest corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 in Section 3, Township 22 North, Range 4 East, W.M.; thence N.O°11'45" W. along the west line of said NW 1/4 a distance of 20 feet; thence N.89°46'25" E. a distance of 555.02 feet to a concrete monument set by King County for the center of South 204th Street; thence N.66°20'16" E. a distance of 99.66 feet; thence N.59°51'16" E. a distance of 227.03 feet to a point of curvature; thence easterly along the arc of a curve to the right, said curve having a radius of 75.00 feet through a central angle of 110°34'00" a distance of 144.73 feet to a point of reverse curve; thence southeasterly along the arc of a curve to the left, said curve having a radius of 119.48 feet through a central angle of 80° 38'51" a distance of 168.17 feet; thence N.89°46'25" E. along a line that is 20 feet north of the south line of said NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 a distance of 255.55 feet to the east line of said subdivision.
