AN ORDINANCE reobligating funding previously appropriated to the CETA Project Employment Fund.

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Unexpected implementation delays have generated budget underrun in the previously appropriated CETA Title VI(b) Fund 218. This underrun funding will be reobligated to authorize the addition of 193 positions in 24 new projects. Three new administrative staff positions will be added to the Public Employment Program.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Accumulated budget underrun funding previously appropriated to the CETA Title VI(b) Fund 218 is hereby reobligated to enable the addition of new positions as listed in the attachment, to the Title VI(b) CETA Program.

SECTION 2. The addition of three new administrative staff positions is hereby authorized to support the expanded Title VI(b) Program activities.

PROVIDED THAT:

The Program Development Division may make adjustments to the approved projects during contract negotiations. The Council will be informed of any approved projects not subsequently funded due to legal, program, or operational problems.

ADDITIONAL PROJECTS RECOMMENDED FOR FUNDING

- 1. K. C. General Services Enforcement of Leash Law Zones, four (4) positions, \$52,716.
- Melbourne Counseling Center Single Parent Family Counseling Project, ten (10) positions, \$128,320.

Agencies submitted 161 new projects for consideration in this package. Project applications were rated by each of four panel members and scores were averaged. Projects were then listed in score order and were recommended for funding down to the point at which all available funds were obligated. 193 of the 840 positions requested were thus identified for funding. The following table summarizes the Title VI(b) - Projects recommendation.

In anticipation of the unexpected delays and deletions which will undoubtedly recur in implementation of the projects in this recommendation, a "Pending List" has been included in the recommendation. This list will be used to replace projects which cannot be implemented or to obligate any underrun funds which are generated in the remainder of the fiscal year. Projects will be selected from this list in score order. The Pending List is comprised of the ten projects which scored immediately below the funding cut-off.

C. Administrative Staff Positions

The addition of the Project Employment Program under Title VI(b) of CETA has, in the last six months, expanded King County's CETA Program from an enrollment of only 760 in July to the 1,580 onboard today. No new administrative staff have been added to help handle this greatly expanded workload. To manage the 170 individual project contracts effectively, two new staff positions should be added immediately. One staff position, an Employment Program Specialist, will assist a current employee to monitor the activity and accomplishments of each project on a quarterly basis. A second Contract Compliance Officer position will ensure that at least one limited audit is conducted annually for each project. One half of a Budget Analyst II position will assist with added budgetary responsibilities associated with the expanded Program funds.

CETA FUNDING RECOMMENDATION January 1978

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NARRATIVE SUMMARY

This ordinance recommends 193 positions be added to King County's Project Employment Program which is funded under Title VI(b) of CETA. The addition of these positions will obligate FY'78 budget underrun funds which have accumulated because of unexpected delays in and deletions of previously authorized projects. No new funds are being appropriated at this time. Because the Title VI(b) Program has more than doubled the size of the County's CETA Program, 3 additional administrative staff positions are also requested.

The County's regular CETA Programs under Titles II and VI(a) are currently operating at full budget. No underrun funding is available to create new positions in these titles at this time.

A. Programmatic Concerns

All funding recommendations are made subject to the establishment and continued maintenance of host agency and individual position eligibility. The Public Employment Program will not complete or will terminate County contracts with agencies which are found to be in serious and irreversible violation of federal or local regulations. PEP will assist agencies to develop required capabilities, but those that cannot meet the minimal standards, even with assistance, will not receive the positions recommended herein.

B. Funding Plan

In two previous ordinances, 3402 and 3243, King County has authorized funding of 989 positions in 157 employment projects. As of December 31, 1977, only 703 of these positions had been filled. Most of the remaining authorized positions have not been filled because 16 agencies have decided not to conduct their projects (83 positions) or because legal or operational problems have delayed the completion of project contracts (10 projects, 118 positions). The budget underrun generated by these unfilled positions is now estimated to be \$1,093,732. To meet the terms of our grant with the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium, this money should be fully expended by the end of September of this year. Since contract negotiations and agency hiring procedures will probably require a month or more, most of this funding will be budgeted for the seven-month period beginning this March. Requesting agencies were instructed to design their projects to last a full twelve months. The attached ranking of the proposals received; lists full year funding amounts. When FY'79 funding is allocated, the remaining five months of funding will be obligated to these projects as a first priority.
