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ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE adopting a Uniform Building Code for King County, in accordance with RCW 19.27; adopting supplemental amendments, additions and deletions to the Code necessary for its application in King County; providing for the issuance of permits and setting of fees; providing for appeals and penalties for violations; repealing Ordinances 1269, 2096, 2505, 2599, and 2626; and KCC 2.36.010, 16.04, 16.08, 16.12, 16.16 and 16.20.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinances 269, 2096, 2505, 2599, and 2626, and KCC 2.36.010, 16.04, 1608, 16.12, 16.16 and 16.20 are each repealed and the following substituted.

SECTION 2. Adoption. The following volumes, as published in book form by the International Conference of Building Officials, together with amendments, additions and deletions hereinafter adopted by reference, are adopted as the building codes of King County and hereinafter referred to as "the code":

- (1) The Uniform Building Code, 1976 Edition (Third printing) with Appendix, and the Uniform Building Code Standards, 1976 Edition (First printing);
- (2) The Uniform Mechanical Code, 1976 Edition (Second printing), with Appendix;
 - (3) The Uniform Housing Code, 1976 Edition (First printing);
- (4) The Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, 1976 Edition (First printing).

SECTION 3. Term amendments. Whenever the following words appear in the code, they are to be chang3d as follows:

- (1) "city" to "county"
- (2) "cities" to "county"
- (3) "city limits" to "county confines"

(4) "city of" to "King County"

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- (5) "city council" to "county council"
- (6) "city treasurer" to "county comptroller"
- (7) "mayor" to "county executive"
- (8) "building official" to "manager, building and land development division, department of planning and community development."

SECTION 4. Appeals and Enforcement

- (1) The following appeal procedures are substituted for those set forth in the Uniform Building Code and Uniform Mechanical Code:
- In order to determine the suitability of alternate materials and methods of construction and to provide for reasonable interpretations of the provisions of the code, the building code advisory and appeals board is hereby established. The board shall consist of thirteen members who are qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to building construction. The manager, building and land development division, shall be an ex officio member and shall act as secretary of the board. building code advisory and appeals board members shall be appointed by the county executive and confirmed by the county council, and shall serve for a two-year term or until their successors are appointed and qualified. The board shall adopt reasonable rules and regulations and shall render all decisions and findings in writing to the manager and to the appellant. The board may recommend amendments to the code consistent with its findings to the county council;
- (b) The manager, building and land development division, or his authorized designee, is authorized to enforce the provisions of the code, and all supplemental regulations adopted by reference in this Title, pursuant to the enforcement and penalty provisions of KCC Title 23;

(2) Appeal procedures involving administration of the Uniform Housing Code and the Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings as adopted in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be set forth in the supplements adopted by reference in Section 6 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. Supplements to the code. The county council hereby declares that supplemental amendments, additions and deletions to the code are necessary for its application in King County. Such supplements shall be prepared by the manager, Building and land development division, and adopted by reference by the council. The manager shall make the adopted supplements readily available at reasonable cost to persons performing any activity subject to the code.

Supplements adopted. The King County supplements SECTION 6. to the adopted 1976 Editions of the Uniform Building Code, Uniform 2 Mechanical Code, Uniform Housing Code, and Uniform Code for the 3 Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, attached to Ordinance 3647 are hereby adopted as part of the code; as such they constitute county regulation for any activity subject to the code. SECTION 7. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, 8 9 the remainder of this ordinance or the application of the pro-10 vision to the other persons or circumstances ahall not be affected. 11 SECTION 8. Additional requirements.
