## ordinance no. 3660

AN ORDINANCE adopting the Uniform Fire Code, 1976 Edition, for King County together with amendments; amending Ordinance 2097, Sections 1, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, and K.C.C. 17.04.010, 17.04.030, 17.04.050, 17.04.060, 17.04,070, 17.04.080, 17.04.090, 17.04,100, 17,04.110, 17.04.120, and 17.04.130; amending Ordinance 3087, Section 7, and K.C.C. 17.08.060; repealing Ordinance 2097, Section 4, and Ordinance 2161, Section 1, and KCC 17.04.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2097, Section 1, and KCC 17.04.010 are each amended to read as follows:

THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE ((1973)) 1976 EDITION, as published by the Western Fire Chiefs Association and the International Conference of Building Officials (including Appendices A ((G;-D;-and-E)) through G, together with amendments, additions and deletions listed in this chapter is adopted as the Fire Code of King County, and hereinafter referred to as "this code".

SECTION 2. ORDINANCE 2097, Section 3, and KCC 17.04.030 are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((Page-14;)) SECTION 1.203, FIRE PREVEN-TION BUREAU, is hereby repealed and the following is substituted: SECTION 1.203. ESTABLISHMENT AND DUTIES OF BUREAU OF FIRE PRE-VENTION. For the purpose of this code the Bureau of Fire Prevention in the Building and Land Development Division of King County shall be operated under the supervision of the ((Director-of Building;)) Fire Marshal, Building and Land Development Division, Department of Planning and Community ((and-Environmental)) Development, and shall enforce the fire prevention provisions and shall have authority in a fire department or fire district in the performance of duties connected with this code. The bureau of Fire Prevention may assume an advisory status in the matters of operation, function, expenditure, tactics, personnel and equipment or any other function as the fire district sees fit to re-The fire suppression and tactical provisions may be enforced by the Chief of a fire department or fire district.

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Chief of a fire department or fire district, acting under the supervision of the Board of Fire Commissioners in that district and in coordination with the Bureau of Fire Prevention, may perform the duties specified in the Uniform Fire Code within the geographical boundaries of that fire protection district, to the full extent required by the Bureau of Fire Prevention.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 2097, Section 4 and Ordinance 2161, Section 1 and KCC 17.04.040 are each repealed.

SECTION 4. Ordinance 2097, Section 5, and KCC 17.04.050 are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((PAGE-18,)) SECTION 1.215, "BOARD OF APPEALS," is amended to read as follows: In order to determine the suitability of alternate materials or methods of construction, and to provide for reasonable interpretation of the provisions of this code, there shall be and is hereby created a Fire Prevention Advisory and Appeals Board, consisting of seven members who are qualified by experience and training in fire protection to pass The Fire Marshal shall be an ex officio upon pertinent matters. member and shall act as Secretary of the Board. The Fire Prevention Advisory and Appeals Board shall be appointed by the County Executive, confirmed by the Council, and shall serve for a twoyear term or until their successor is appointed and qualified. Initially four members shall be appointed to a two-year term and three members to a one-year term. The Board shall adopt reasonable rules and regulations for conducting its investigations and shall render all decisions and findings in writing to the Fire Marshal with a duplicate copy to the appellant and may recommend to the County Council such new legislation as is consistent therewith.

SECTION 5. Ordinance 2097, Section 6, and KCC 17.04.060 are each amended to read as follows: A new section is hereby added to the UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((PAGE-36)) ARTICLE 1, DIVISION IV, DEFINITIONS, to read as follows:

SECTION 1.429. DEFINITION OF CURRENT EDITION. (1) Current

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edition of the Uniform Building Code shall be the ((1973)) 1976

Edition; (2) Current edition of the Uniform Mechanical Code shall be the ((1973)) 1976 Edition; and (3) Current edition of the National Fire Protection Association shall be the ((1971-1972)) 1976 Edition.

SECTION 6. Ordinance 2097, Section 7, and KCC 17.04.070 are each amended to read as follows: A new division, Division V, is hereby added to the Uniform Fire Code, ((PAGE-36,)) ARTICLE 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS, as follows:

DIVISION V. Section 1.501. VIOLATION PROVISIONS. Notwithstanding any specific remedies enumerated in the text of codes adopted by reference in this document or other regulations herein adopted; violation, or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, shall subject the offender, upon conviction there of, to a fine of not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both, and each day that such violation or failure to comply exist shall constitute a separate offense. The prosecutor may, as an alternative to criminal action, seek legal or equitable relief to enjoin or abate any violation of the laws incorporated by reference herein.

Section 1.502. CIVIL PENALTY APPEAL. In addition to or as an alternate to any judicial or administrative remedy provided herein or by law, any person, firm, corporation or organization violating any of the provisions of this Code, or by each act of commission or omission procures, aids or abets such violation, shall incure a cumulative civil penalty in the amount of three dollars per day, per each violation, plus billable costs of the Building and Land Development Division, Department of Planning and Community ((and-Environmental)) Development, from the date set for compliance until such violation is corrected or such notice of violation is complied with. All civil penalties and appeals will be enforced in accordance with the procedures

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specified in ((the-Uniform-Housing-Gode,-1973-Edition,-as-amended and-adopted-by-this-ordinance.)) KCC Title 23, Enforcement.

SECTION 7. Ordinance 2097, Section 8, and KCC 17.04.080, are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE ((PAGES-71-and-72)) ARTICLE 12, FIREWORKS, is hereby repealed. (For control of fireworks see ((Ghapter))

KCC 6.26 ((ef-this-county-code-)).

SECTION 8. Ordinance 2097, Section 9, and KCC 17.04.090 are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((PAGE-75,)) SECTION 13.208, REQUIRED VERTICAL DRIVEWAY CLEARANCE, is amended to read as follows: Acces driveways serving buildings or property located more than one hundred fifty (150) feet from a street shall have a vertical clearance of not less than twelve (12) feet above the finished driveway surface.

EXCEPTION: Groups R-3 and M Occupancies as specified in the Building Code.

Where auxiliary means of access or fire protective measures, approved by the Fire Marshal, are provided, the above required clearance may be modified or waived.

Fire lanes shall be established at buildings as required by the Fire Marshal. Such fire lanes shall be maintained with adequate height and width to allow access, and have a surface capable of supporting fire apparatus. Fire lanes shall be appropriately marked and obstruction of fire lanes is prohibited by other than emergency vehicles.

Obstruction of a fire lane by a parked vehicle or any other object shall be deemed a public nuisance and immediate hazard to life and property; upon a signed complaint by the Fire Marshal, his authorized designee, or the Chief of the Fire District, it shall be abated immediately without prior notification to the owner of the obstructing vehicle or object.

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SECTION 9. Ordinance 2097, Section 10, and KCC 17.04.100 are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((PAGE-77,)) SECTION 13.307, FIRE ALARM SYSTEMS, is amended by adding a new subsection as follows: (e) FIRE DRILLS. Fire drills shall be held at least once a month in educational occupancies where such occupandies constitute the major occupancy of a building and at least once every two months in institutional occupancies where such occupancies constitute the major occupancy of a building. During severe weather, fire drills may be postponed. A record of all fire drills shall be kept by the person in charge of such occupancies. Records of fire drills shall include the time and date of each drill held.

In educational occupancies fire drills shall include complete evacuation of all persons from the building. In institutional occupancies fire drills shall be conducted to familiarize operating personnel with their assigned positions of emergency duty; complete evacuation of occupants from the building at the time of the fire drill shall be required only where it is practicable and does not involve moving or disturbing persons under medical care.

SECTION 10. Ordinance 2097, Section 11, and KCC 17.04.110, are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((PAGE-129)) SECTION 15.704, DISPENSING SERVICES, SUB-SECTION (b) SUPERVISION, is hereby amended to read as follows: Every service station open to the public shall have an attendant or supervisor on duty whenever the station is open for business.

1. If the dispensing of Class 1 liquids at a service station available and open to the public is to be done by a person other than the service station attendant, the nozzle shall be a listed automatic closing type without latch open device.

SECTION 11. Ordinance 2097, Section 12, and KCC 17.04.120 are each amended to read as follows:

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UNIFORM FIRE CODE ((PAGES-135-and-136) \$ECTION 15.710, MARINE SERVICE STATIONS, SUB-SECTION (d) DISPENSING, paragraph 3, is amended to read as follows: Dispensing of flammable or combustible liquids into the fuel tanks of marine craft shall be my means of an approved type hose, equipped with a listed automatic closing nozzle without a latch open device.

SECTION 12. Ordinance 2027, Section 13 and KCC 17,04.130 are each amended to read as follows:

A new section is hereby added to the UNIFORM FIRE CODE, ((PAGE-210)) ARTICLE 31, WELDING AND CUTTING, CALCIUM CARBIDE AND ACETYLENE, to read as follows:

SECTION 31.114. PERMIT REQUIRED. A "no fee" permit shall be required of each company, corporation, co-partnership or owner-operator performing welding or cutting operations. This permit shall not be required for each welding or cutting job location. The company, corporation, co-partnership or owner-operator shall notify the Bureau of Fire Prevention in advance where such work is taking place, except where such work is done in response to an emergency call that does not allow time for the Bureau of Fire Prevention to be notified in advance of the work.

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1 SECTION 13. Ordinance 3087, Section 7, and KCC 17.08.060 2 are each amended to read as follows: 3 Fire Flow Criteria. Required fire flows determined by the fire marshall shall be based on criteria set forth in the Guide 5 for Determination of Required Fire Flow 1974 Edition published 6 by the Insurance Service Office.
