 ORDINANCE NO. 3681

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Policy Development Commission; stating its purpose, altering its committee structure and clarifying the responsibilities of its staff; amending Ordinance 2208, Sections 3, 4, 5, 10, 11, and 12, K.C.C. 20.20.010, 20.20.020, 20.20.030, 20.20.080, 20.20.090, and 20.20.100; adding new sections to Ordinance 2208, and K.C.C. 20.20; and repealing Ordinance 2208, Sections 6, 7, 8, and 9, and K.C.C. 20.20.040, 20.20.050,20.20.060, and 20.20.070.

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2208, Section 3, and K.C.C. 20.20.010 are amended to read as follows:

Creation <u>and purpose</u>. A Policy Development Commission is created involving citizens of King County in an advisory capacity to assist in planning for land use, transportation systems, utilities, public facilities, recreation, housing, community development, conservation, human services and capital improvements. The basic purpose of the Policy Development Commission is to provide effective opportunities for the citizens of King County to participate in the policy making processes of county government. The Policy Development Commission is authorized to collect information on public policy issues of concern, to assist in the dissemination to the public of information pertinent to county government, and to undertake programs designed to enhance citizen participation in county government.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> <u>SECTION 2.</u> Policy Development Commission and Board of Directors--Composition. The Policy Development Commission shall consist of:

- (1) A board of directors of 18 members appointed as provided in Section 5 (a) of this ordinance, and
- (2) 100 citizens appointed as provided in Section 5 (b) of this ordinance.
- SECTION 3. Ordinance 2208, Section 4, and K.C.C. 20.20.020 are amended as follows:

The chairperson of the Board of Directors shall designate committee membership from the membership of the Commission, and shall name the committee chairpersons. In the event that a committee requires special resources in order to carry out a particular assignment effectively, the chairperson may, with the consent of the board, name individuals who are not members of the Commission to serve, up to a maximum of one fifth of the total membership of such committee.

SECTION 4. Ordinance 2208, Section 5, and K.C.C. 20.20.030 are amended as follows:

Rules adoption. The ((eommission)) Board of Directors and committees shall adopt rules for the transaction of their business and each shall keep a public record of their transactions, findings and determinations. ((;provided-that-o))

Official recommendations to the Executive and Council shall be by the affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the total members of the ((eommission)) board. Such recommendations shall be by a recorded motion which shall incorporate the findings of the ((eommission)) board and the reasons for its action.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. Policy Development Commission and Board of Directors--Appointment and Terms.

- (a) Appointments and terms of members of the Board of Directors shall be as follows:
- (1) A chairperson and a vice-chairperson of the Board of Directors shall be selected by the County Council. The term of the incumbent chairperson shall end June 30, 1979, and that of the incumbent vice-chair-person shall end June 30, 1978. Thereafter the terms of the chairperson and vice-chairperson shall be for a two-year period commencing July 1, of each second year following that determined herein. The Chairperson and vice-chairperson shall be eligible for reappointment only

June 30, 1979, and forty-nine members whose terms shall end June 30, 1981. Thereafter the terms of these commission members shall be for a four-year period commencing July 1, or each fourth year following that determined by lots. These commission members shall be eligible for reappointment only once, but may also be eligible for appointment to the Board of Directors as provided in subsection (a) of this section.

(c) Consideration should be given to selecting members from as broad a geographic and demographic representation as possible and who have demonstrated interest and knowledge of the issues to be considered.

SECTION 10. Ordinance 2208, Section 10, and K.C.C. 20.20.080 are hereby amended as follows:

Vacancies ((filling)). (a) Vacancies ((in)) on the commission ((or-committees)) shall be filled by appointment in the same manner in which the members are initially appointed as provided in Section ((s-20-20-060-and-20-20-070-)) 5 of this ordinance. Nominations to fill vacancies caused by the expiration of terms shall be filed at least thirty days preceding the expiration of the terms, and nominations to fill other vacancies shall be filed within thirty days of the creation of the vacancy. Appointment to a vacated position shall be for the unexpired portion of the term. ((If-no-appointment-for-a-position-has-been made-within-seventy-five-days-of-the-effective-date-of-the vacancy,-that-position-may-be-filled-by-majority-vote-of-the Gounty-Gouneil-))

(b) If a member of the commission misses three consecutive regular meetings, or at least one half of the meetings during any six month period of the board or committee of which he or she is a member, without prior approval of the appropriate chairperson, the position shall be vacated.
