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ORDINANCE NO. 4177

AN ORDINANCE approving an amendment to the City of North Bend's Comprehensive Water System Plan.

PREAMBLE:

On January 16, 1979, the City of North Bend approved Amendment No. 2 to the Comprehensive Water System Plan for the City of North Bend.

The City of North Bend filed a Final Declaration of Non-Significance for the proposed water main extension on February 16, 1979.

The Utilities Technical Review Committee reviewed the proposed plan amendment as required by KCC 13.24 and on March 14, 1979 recommended conditional approval.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Amendment No. 2 to the Comprehensive Water System

Plan for the City of North Bend (attached) is hereby approved provided that this action is expressly limited to the approval of water service to the A. E. Downes Company manufacturing plant and other existing land uses adjoining this water main. Any other properties or actions, including the Meadowbrook Farm annexation and development proposal shall be the subject of separate review.

The Plan is hereby amended to include the Snoqualmie-Meadowbrook Road Water Main Extension described as follows:

Approximately 4,700 linear feet of 12-inch diameter pipe beginning at 4th Street and Bendego extending westerly along 4th Street hence across the South Fork of the Snoqualmie River Bridge and along Highway 202 right-of-way (also S.E. Snoqualmie North Bend Road), hence along the Snoqualmie-Meadowbrook Road and ending at the A.E. Downs Co.

The Plan shall also be amended to include an extension of 12-inch and 8-inch main along S.E. 106th Street from the above described Snoqualmie-Meadowbrook main westerly approximately 2,000 linear feet.

This proposed Amendment No. 2 is shown on revised Comprehensive Plan Plate No. 4.

This amendment has been considered a minor addition to the City of North Bend Comprehensive Water System Plan, and is consistent with the Environmental Impact Statement prepared in January 1976. A separate Environmental Checklist has been prepared for this project, and the responsible official has made a determination of non-significance for this action.

This amendment is hereby approved by the City of North Bend on Jan 16, 1979.
