

ORDINANCE NO. 4307

AN ORDINANCE relating to sewer and water comprehensive plans, designating the Director of Public Works as the King County Engineer for the purpose of RCW 56.08.020 and RCW 57.16.010, clarifying the authority of the UTRC and amending Ordinance 2865, Sections 1 and 3; Ordinance 1709, Sections 1, 7 and 8; KCC 13.24.010, 13.24.050, 13.24.070, and 13.24.080; and adding new sections to KCC 13.24

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2865, Section 1, Ordinance 1709, Section 1 and KCC 13.24.010 are each amended to read as follows:

District comprehensive plans. Comprehensive plans for water and sewer districts and entities which distribute water or provide sewer service in unincorporated areas of King County, Washington, shall be adopted by each such district or (~~distributor~~) entity and approved by King County as a prerequisite for the granting of new right-of-way franchises and right-of-way construction permits and right-of-way franchise renewals. Such plans shall be (~~approved by the director of the Department of Public Works and the director of the King County Department of Public Health, and shall be~~) reviewed by a utilities technical review committee established by (~~the ordinance codified in~~) this chapter prior to submission to the King County Council for approval; provided that sewer and water (~~district and water distributor~~) comprehensive plans approved by the County prior to July 1, 1973, will not require further approval for the purposes of this chapter until December 30, 1976.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. There is added to KCC 13.24 a new section to read as follows:

The director of the Department of Public Works, or his authorized designee, shall be the engineer designated by King County for the approvals required by RCW 56.08.020 and RCW 57.16.010.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 2638, Section 3, Ordinance 1709, Section 5 and KCC 13.24.050 are each amended to read as follows:

Comprehensive Plans - Approval Requirements. Comprehensive plans approved by the County shall (~~not~~) contain the elements listed in KCC 13.24.020 or 13.24.030 listed above and shall not be inconsistent with

2 (1) King County (~~Ordinance No. 468~~) Code Chapter 17.08  
3 relating to the installation of fire hydrants and water mains;

4 (2) State and local health standards;

5 (3) County comprehensive plan; adopted community plans,  
6 and pertinent County adopted plans and policies; provided that in  
7 those areas where a community plan has not been adopted, the  
8 approval of new significant general purpose improvements to water  
9 systems, including pumping, storage, source, or transmission mains,  
10 shall be limited to serve existing or permitted uses. Existing or  
11 permitted uses shall not be construed to mean new residential  
12 subdivisions, short subdivisions, or planned unit developments.

13 (4) The basin wide water and/or sewerage plan (~~as~~) when  
14 approved by the State Department of Ecology and the State Depart-  
15 ment of Ecology and the State Department of Social and Health  
16 Services:

17 (5) Applicable state (~~and federal~~) water quality and  
18 waste management standards; and

19 (6) The King County Sewerage General Plan.

20 Section 4. Ordinance 1709, Section 7, and KCC 13.24.070 are  
21 each amended to read as follows:

22 Utilities technical review committee - Authority. The utili-  
23 ties technical review committee shall review and make recommenda-  
24 tions to the King County Executive and to the King County Council  
25 on the adequacy of all sewer and water (~~district and water~~  
26 ~~distributor~~) comprehensive plans and related matters, and deter-  
27 mination of their consistency with the King County Comprehensive  
28 plan; provided, further, that the committee shall have the  
29 authority to approve additions (~~s~~) and betterments (~~and~~  
30 ~~adjustments~~) to council approved sewer and water (~~district and~~  
31 ~~water-distributor~~) comprehensive plans without referral to the

1 Council in order to serve developments which have received pre-  
2 liminary approval from the King County Council.

3 SECTION 5. Ordinance 1709, Section 8 and KCC 13.24.080 are  
4 each amended to read as follows:

5 Procedures. (a) Required copies of all sewer and water  
6 (~~district-and-water-distributor~~) comprehensive plans shall be  
7 submitted (~~by-the-district-or-distributor~~) to the King County  
8 (~~Department-of-Public-Works~~) Division of Building and Land  
9 Development. The (~~Department-of-Public-Works~~) Division of  
10 Building and Land Development shall have the major responsibility  
11 for coordination and support for the utilities technical review  
12 committee.

13 (b) Notice of the time and place of the utilities technical  
14 review committee meeting shall be provided to the applicant for  
15 comprehensive plan approval prior to the meeting.

16 (c) The applicant shall have the right to attend or be  
17 represented at any and all meetings upon request.
