## ORDINANCE NO. 4327

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of . Avondale Road N.E. Norman D. Fragner and Others Petitioner:

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 1. Avondale Road N.E., hereinafter described.
- The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and was advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- The vacation area is a portion of Avondale Road N.E. formerly known as Redmond-Bear Creek Road when established as a 60-foot road in 1929. In 1968, an additional 12 feet was deeded along the northwesterly margin of the East leg of the "Y" intersection in the subject area. In 1976, the County Council vacated the northwesterly 20 feet of the 72-foot East leg of the "Y" intersection. The petition requests vacation of all of the rest of the East leg of the "Y".
- 5. The vacation area contains approximately 17,704 square feet. northwesterly portion of the vacation area contains approximately 7,638 square feet and the southeasterly portion 10,066 square feet.
- The vacation area has been maintained by County forces for many years. Therefore, the road is classified "B Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759. King County is now in receipt of \$5,310.00 from the petitioners which has been judged to be the just compensation to King County for this vacation area.
- 7. The Department of Public Works considers the subject vacation area useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the //th day of Chife

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
SECTION 1. The Council on the 1/th day of June, 1979,
hereby vacates and abandons the portion of Avondale Road N.E., described as
follows:
That portion of County Road No. 1328 (Avondale Road) described as follows: The east leg of the "Y" of Avondale Road NE which was established April 22, 1929, in Section 7, Township 26 N., Range 6 E, W.M., and known as Redmond-Bear Creek Road; EXCEPT that portion lying West of a line that is 42 feet East of the Northerly extension of the centerline of Redmond-Bear Creek Road; said extension running in a straight line on the established bearing of N 5°57' E to the centerline of Woodinville-Duvall Road; ALSO EXCEPT that portion lying Northerly of a line that is 50 feet Southerly of the centerline of the Woodinville-Duvall Road as surveyed by King County Road Survey No. 1-26-5-10; ALSO EXCEPT the Northwesterly 20 feet of the 72 feet previously vacated by King County Ordinance No. 2968 (V-1509).
