ORDINANCE NO. 4406

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of 164th Avenue S.E.

Petitioner: Puget Sound Environmental Group, Inc. and Others

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 164th Avenue S.E., hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and were advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The vacation area is a portion of the plat of Cedar Park Five Acre Tracts, which was recorded on June 28, 1907. The Department of Public Works found no evidence that the vacation area has been open as a road. A search of the records indicates that the County has spent no funds for its acquisition or maintenance. Right of Way would, therefore, be classified "C Class" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 5. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION I. The Council on the 23 day of July , 19 hereby vacates and abandons that portion of 164th Avenue S.E., described as follows:
