

ORDINANCE NO. 0004469

AN ORDINANCE reallocating recaptured Community Development Block Grant funds; authorizing the County Executive to apply to the Joint Policy Committee for recaptured needs funds; appropriating \$34,956 to the River and Flood Control Construction Fund from a transfer from the Community Development Block Fund; amending Ordinance No. 3969, Sections 70 and 71, Attachment No. 1, as amended.

PREAMBLE:

The Department of Housing and Urban Development is requiring that local governments spend Community Development Block Grant funds at a faster rate. It is the purpose of this ordinance to reallocate existing County Population funds and to compete for needs funds made available by project completions and abandonments. This ordinance is in response to a special process established by the Joint Policy Committee.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Recaptured County Population Funds in the Community Development Block Grant fund are hereby reallocated to the following projects:

- 1. CD-989-79 Neighborhood Business District Assistance \$15,490
- 2. CD-431-78 White Center Drainage & 79 \$34,956
- 3. CD-442A-79 Maple Valley Community Center \$10,000

SECTION 2. The following County Population Fund projects in the Block Grant fund are hereby cancelled.

- 1. CD-414-77 Fall City Sewer Study \$3,000
- 2. CD-672-78 Soos Creek Rural Farm Program \$1,950
- 3. CD-869-79 Cooperative Funding Strategy \$20,000

SECTION 3. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$34,956 to the River and Flood Control Construction Fund from a transfer from the Community Development Block Grant Fund for White Center Drainage Improvements, CIP Project No. 045226.

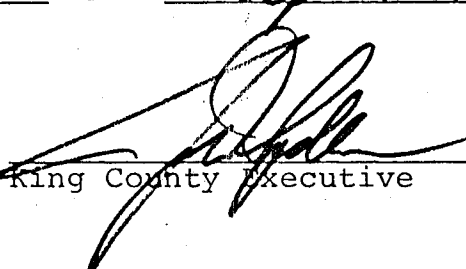

A recently completed feasibility study recommended several alternatives to reduce the flooding in the area of White Center. In a second phase, now underway, construction plans and technical specifications, cost estimates and an environmental impact statement will be prepared. Funding for this effort is \$75,500. Acquisition of needed right of way and construction of 1) the connection between the Lake Hicks Storm sewer to the abandoned government line including the bypass around Southwest Suburban Sewer District sewage treatment plant, and 2) the storm drain line between Hicks Lake Village, and the start of implementation for the area upstream (north) of Kingston Village are included in the next phase of this project.
