

ORDINANCE NO. ~~0004499~~

AN ORDINANCE relating to the ballot submittal of a levy to provide emergency medical services; amending Ordinance No. 4480, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4480, Section 6, is amended to read as follows:

Levy Rate. The rate at which this levy shall be submitted to the voters shall be the sum of \$.21 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation (~~each-year-for-six-consecutive-years~~).

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 4480, Section 9, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Pursuant to RCW 29.13.010, it is hereby deemed that an emergency exists requiring the submission to the qualified electors of the County at a special county election to be held therein on November 6, 1979, in conjunction with the state-wide general election to be held on the same date of a proposition authorizing the previously described six-year levy for emergency medical services. The manager of the Division of Records and Elections shall cause notice to be given of this ordinance in accordance with the State Constitution and general law and to submit to the qualified electors of the county at the said special county election, the proposition hereinafter set forth.

The Administrator-Clerk of the Council is hereby authorized and directed to certify that proposition to the manager of the King County Division of Records and Elections in substantially the following form:

King County, Washington

Proposition _____: Regular Property Tax

Levy for Emergency Medical Services

Shall King County be authorized to levy a regular property tax in the sum of \$.21/1,000.00 of assessed valuation each year for six consecutive years beginning in 1979, to be collected beginning in

1 1980, ((in-the-sum-of-\$,21,1,000.00-of-assessed-valuation)) for
2 the provision of emergency medical services, all as provided in
3 King County Ordinance No. 4480.



10 institutions.




