

ORDINANCE NO. 4635

AN ORDINANCE making appropriation to the Public Service Employment Fund and amending Ordinance 3969 Section 52, as amended, and declaring an emergency.

PREAMBLE:

King County has received allocations from the Department of Labor through the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium for the continuation of its CETA Titles II and VI grants through December 1979. These allocations will be used to maintain the regular Public Service Employment Program which is funded under Titles II and VI(a) at current enrollment levels and to continue operation of the Title VI(b) Project Employment Program.

The funds as granted will allow for continuance of 231 positions under the regular Title II/VI(a) Program and 429 positions under the Title VI(b) Project Program.

The funds are distributed as follows:

- \$ 944,600 in Title II FY '80 Funds
- \$ 436,890 in Title VI(a) FY '80 Funds
- \$ 1,283,740 in Title VI(b) FY '80 Funds

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$2,665,230 to the Public Service Employment Fund from Federal fiscal 1980 Grant Funds from the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium.

SECTION 2. From the Public Service Employment Fund there is hereby appropriated: ((~~\$11,532,136~~)) \$14,197,366

1 Provided that:


2 All provisos adopted by the Council in Ordinance 3969, as

8 institutions.




