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The mobile home and all other structures on the lot

shall meet the minimum yard, height, building placement and lot

coverage promisions of the applicable zone;

The mobile home shall be removed when justification

for its use terminates.

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SECTION 2. Ordinance 3495, Section 5, Ordinance 822, Section 7, Ordinance 521, Section 6, and KCC 18.04.080 are hereby amended as follows:

Mobile homes—Temporary uses for. (a) Applicants who are in the process of building a dwelling may apply for a temporary permit, which shall be subject to renewal, to locate a mobile home on the building lot during the course of construction of the dwelling. Such permit shall not be issued until after a building permit (for the building) has been obtained.

(b) Mobile homes may be used as caretaker's quarters at various job sites, i.e., construction projects, gravel pits and/or dumping operations which are controlled by other permits of limited time duration. All other types of caretaker quarters must meet the requirements for dwellings.

## (c) Mobile homes may be used as provided for in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Mobile homes used for temporary uses must have an approval on sewage disposal system, water supply and electrical connection.

A temporary use permit may be issued by the Building and Land Development Division for a period not to exceed six months; provided, the Division, for good cause shown, may renew the permit for an additional period, at which time the temporary use (mobile home) and all appurtenances thereto shall be removed from the property.

As a condition to the issuance of a temporary permit under the provisions of this section, the owner shall submit to the county acceptable authority and permission for the county to enter upon the owner's property and remove the mobile home and all appurtenances thereto if the owner fails to comply with the removal provisions of this chapter. The owner shall further deposit with the building official, or in approved irrevocable escrow, cash or its equivalent in the minimum amount of three

hundred dollars to ensure compliance with the provisions of the permit.

Upon satisfactory termination of the temporary use permit, and removal of the mobile home unit and all appurtenances thereto, the deposit shall be returned to the permittee. Failure to comply with these provisions shall cause forfeiture of the deposit and authorize the county to go on the property and remove the mobile home and all appurtenances thereto, but shall in no way relieve the permittee of the responsibility of compliance with the provisions of the permit.

A temporary use permit will be issued by the Building and Land Development Division. The fee will be thirty-five dollars and is in addition to all other required permits for electrical, plumbing and sewage disposal systems.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. Non-Insignia Mobile Homes. All individual mobile homes to be located within King County that do not have an insignia of approval from the Washington State Department of Labor and Industries, or the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and for which the owner can demonstrate proof of residency within King County before the effective date of this ordinance, are subject to Building and Land Development Division inspection for the following minimum livability requirements before they may be moved to a new location or before they may be occupied by nonowner residents:

- 1. The unit must have safe, operable heating facilities capabile of maintaining a room temperature of 65°F at a point three feet above the floor in all habitable rooms.
- 2. The unit must be equipped with a water closet, lavatory, bathtub or shower, and kitchen sink; be provided with hot and cold running water; and all facilities shall be installed and maintained in a safe and sanitary condition.

- All electrical service-entrance conductors, service equipment, switches, lighting outlets, power outlets and appliances shall be maintained in a safe manner.
- The structure must be weather protected so as to provide shelter for the occupants against the elements and to exclude dampness.
- 5. All openable windows and doors must be in operable condition to provide for adequate natural ventilation and emergency exit.
- An operable smoke detector shall be installed within the unit.
- The unit shall be structurally sound with no apparent hazardous condition in floors, walls, ceilings and roofs.
- The unit must be well maintained, free of debris and infestation of insects, vermin or rodents.

An inspection fee of twenty dollars must be paid at the time an inspection is requested.
