AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of South 204th Street V-1659 Petitioner: Mr. & Mrs. John Saladis and Others

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of South 204th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and was advised that an easement has been obtained by King County Water District No. 75.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that the subject right-of-way is used as part of the neighborhood pedestrian circulation pattern. Since the King County Code (19.12.070) requires a crosswalk at approximately the center of blocks over nine hundred feet in length, the Division recommends vacation of all but 10 feet on each side of the centerline of the subject right-of-way to allow continued use for pedestrian circulation and as a crosswalk for the block. Similar recommendations were received from the Department of Public Works! Traffic and Operations sections.
- 4. The legal description furnished on the petition has been revised to retain 10 feet on each side of the centerline of South 204th Street as recommended by the Division of Building and Land Development and the Department of Public Works.
- 5. The vacation area, totaling approximately 8,400 square feet, is a portion of the Plat of Southern Pacific Land Company's Huntington Park Addition to Des Moines, which was recorded on October 25, 1889, in Volume 4, page 24, Records of King County. The Department of Public Works found no records that would indicate public funds have been expended for acquisition or maintenance of the vacation area. Right of way would, therefore, be classified "C Class" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 6. The Department of Public Works considers the remaining subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
