### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the 1980 budget and amending Ordinance No. 4597, Sections 21, 42, 43, 44, 45, 51, 54, 56, 59, 60, 61, 67, 70, 73, and 74.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4597, Section 21, is hereby amended to read as follows:

## PROVIDED THAT:

1) The Program Development Division with assistance from the Parks and Human Services Divisions shall review the program and organizational location of the Office of Aging, and prepare a report to be presented to the Council before May 1, 1980.

The Report shall contain the following elements:

- A review of alternative organizational locations including, but not limited to, the Parks and Human Services Divisions, and a potential merger with the Seattle-King County Division of Aging;
- A review of the 1980 Office of Aging Work Program b) in relation to functions/services provided by other aging entities including recommendations for reducing duplication of services and for cost-effective staff levels;
- c ) A review of the Area Agency of Aging with respect to the forthcoming State redesignation, including an evaluation of King County assuming the Area Agency role.

### The Council intends that:

- The Office of Aging shall develop an alternative formula for apportioning Federal and State Aging resources between Seattle and King County which accurately reflects the location of senior population within the respective areas. The formula shall be presented to the Council before May 1, 1980.
- The Office of Aging shall be relocated from the Department of Budget and Program Development in 1980 to function as a line organization.

Included in Special Programs is an Executive Contingency of ((\$350;000)) \$322,160 which shall not be expended unless the County Executive certifies in writing that funds are available and requests that the County Council adopt an additional appropriation ordinance; upon adoption, suchfunds may be expended for the purpose specified.

## PROVIDED THAT:

- 1) The Executive shall report to the Council on the results of the changes in the Merit Pay Plan approved by the Council for 1980.
- 2) \$15,000 shall be used to complete a feasibility study for a school community demonstration farm/environmental and energy learning center to be located in King County. The study shall be carried out by the Washington State Office of Environmental Education and should:
  - a. Identify feasible sites;

  - e ) A description of projected beginning and ending fund balances for each CIP Fund for 1980 and 1981 given the Executive proposed budget as the expenditure element used to arrive at ending fund balance.
