ordinance no. 4776

AN ORDINANCE relating to notice requirements for certain land use decisions, modifying the requirements for notice of public hearing for . preliminary plats and for notice on certain short plats, and correcting typing errors in Ordinance 4460; amending Ordinance 4460, Sections 1, 2 and 3.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

Ordinance 4460, Section 1, is hereby amended to SECTION 1. A garage of a large read as follows:

Notice of Public Hearing. The Building and Land Development Division shall cause notice to be given of the time and place of the public hearing on a proposed preliminary plat as follows:

- By first class mail sent 30 days prior to the date of hearing, to owners, including applicant, of property located within 500 feet of any boundary of the subject property, provided that the area within which mailed notice is required may be expanded in rural or lightly inhabited areas or in other appropriate cases to the extent the Division determines is necessary to include affected property owners. Notice shall contain:
- the name and total area of the proposed plat, the number of proposed lots and typical lot sizes, the proposed use and the name of the plat applicant;
 - a legal description in non-legal language;
- (((d))) (c) the time and place of hearing at which interested parties may be heard;
- (((e))) (d) a form to request a copy of the Division report; and,
- $((\{\{\}\}))$ (e) identification of the responsible county official.

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Mailed notice as herein provided is supplementary to official hearing notification by publication and posting and the failure of one or more owners to receive mailed notice shall not affect the scheduling or validity of the hearing if notice was given pursuant to subsections (3) and (4) below.

- 2. By first class mail sent 30 days prior to the date of the hearing to:
- (a) any city located within one mile of any boundary of the subject property;
- (b) any city which has a utility which is proposed to serve the plat; and,
- (c) the state Department of Transportation where the plat or part thereof adjoins a state right-of-way. The content of the notice shall be as provided in subsection 1 above.
- 3. By publication at least 20 days prior to the date of hearing in the official county newspaper and another newspaper of general circulation in the affected community.
- 4. By posting 30 days prior to the date of hearing at least three signs or posters on or adjacent to the subject property at places conspicuous and likely to be seen by persons passing the property. The form and content of the notice shall be approved by the Division. Posting, including the expenses thereof, shall be the responsibility of the applicant and an affidavit of posting shall be submitted ((within-seven-(7)-days ef-posting)) prior to the hearing by the applicant to the Division in a form approved by the Division.
- 5. By any other method if the Division determines it appropriate for the purpose of proposed preliminary plat, including but not limited to providing notification of the proposed action and hearing to local or community newspapers.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 4460, Section 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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Notice of Public Hearing. The Building and Land Development Division shall cause notice to be given of the time and place of the public hearing for a proposed zoning reclassification, shoreline environment redesignation, planned unit development, unclassified use, variance and conditional use as follows:

- 1. By first class mail sent 30 days prior to the date of hearing to owners of property within 500 feet of any boundary of the subject property, provided that the area within which mailed notice is required may be expanded in rural or lightly inhabited areas or in other appropriate cases to the extent the Division determines is necessary to include affected property owners. Notice shall contain:
- (a) the name of the applicant, the description of the requested action and the proposed use of the property;
- (b) a vicinity map or general location description in non-legal language;
- (c) the time and place of public hearing at which interested parties may be heard;
 - (d) a form to request the Division report; and,
- (e) identification of the responsible county official. Mailed notice as herein provided is supplementary to official hearing notification by publication and posting and the failure of one or more owners to receive mailed notice shall not affect the scheduling or validity of the hearing if notice was given pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) below.
- 2. By publication 20 days prior to the date of hearing in the official county newspaper and another newspaper of general circulation in the affected community.
- 3. By posting at least 30 days prior to the date of hearing at least three signs or posters on or adjacent to the subject property at places conspicuous and likely to be seen by persons

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passing the property. The form and content of the notice shall be approved by the Division. Posting, including the expenses thereof, shall be the responsibility of the applicant and an affidavit of posting shall be submitted ((within-seven-(7)-days of-posting)) prior to the hearing by the applicant to the Division in a form approved by the Division.

4. By any other method if the Building and Land Development Division determines it appropriate for the purpose of
giving notice to interested parties, including but not limited
to providing notification of the proposed action and hearing
to local or community newspapers.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 4460, Section 3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Notice of Application. Upon receipt of short subdivision applications authorized by KCC 19.26.020(2) or (3) which will result in the creation of five or more lots on adjacent properties under common ownership, the Division shall cause notice of such applications to be given within ((ten-(10))) twenty (20) days of the filing of such applications as provided herein. addition, where the Division receives a short subdivision application which is adjacent to property for which a short subdivision application has been submitted within the preceding twenty-four months and the proposed and previously submitted short subdivisions in combination would create 5 or more lots on such adjacent properties, the Division may in its descretion cause notice of such application to be given as provided herein. If notice is given pursuant to this section, the recommended review period contained in KCC 19.26.100(b) shall commence ten days after notice of the application has been mailed.

Notice required pursuant to this section shall be as follows:

1. By first class mail to owners of property within

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500 feet of any boundary of the subject property, provided that the area within which mailed notice is required may be expanded in rural or lightly inhabited areas or in other appropriate cases to the extent the Division determines is necessary to include affected property owners. Notice shall contain:

- (a) the identifying number of the short plats, the total area of the plats, the number and typical lot size, the proposed use, and the name of the applicant;
- (b) a vicinity map or general location description in non-legal language;
- (c) a statement that written materials may be submitted to the Division within ten (10) days after notice is sent;
- (d) a form to request the preliminary and final short subdivisions as approved by the Division; and,
- (e) a statement of county appeal procedures. ((Mailed notice-as-herein-provided-is-supplementary-to-official-hearing notification-by-publication-and-posting-and-failure-of-one-or more-owners-to-receive-mailed-notice-shall-not-affect-the-sched-uling-or-validity-of-the-hearing-if-notice-was-given-pursuant-to subsection-(3)-below:))
 - 2. By first class mail sent to:

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- (a) any city located within one mile of any boundary of the subject property;
- (b) any city which has a utility which is proposed to serve the short subdivision; and,
- (c) the state Department of Transportation where the plat or part thereof adjoins an state, right-of-way.

The content of notice shall be as approved in subsection 1 above.

3. By any other method if the Division deems it appropriate for the purpose of giving notice to interested parties,

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
