ORDINANCE NO. 4821

AN ORDINANCE authorizing condemnation of property for the King County Correctional Facility site.

1. The King County Council on November 21, 1979, by Ordinance No. 4597, did adopt the 1980 Annual Budget and Program, which included a Capital Improvement Budget and Program.

- 2. The Capital Improvement Budget and Program provides for the acquisition and construction of the King County Correctional Facility.
- 3. In order to acquire the property and property rights for the King County Correctional Facility, it is necessary for King County to condemn certain lands and property rights as hereinafter more particularly set forth.
- 4. The King County Council finds that the public health, safety, necessity, convenience and welfare demand that that King County Correctional Facility be constructed in accordance with the King County Capital Budget and Program, and that certain properties, property rights and rights in property be condemned, appropriated, taken and damaged for construction of said facility, as provided in this ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The King County Council has deemed it necessary and in the best interest of the citizens of King County that the lands hereinafter described, and other property rights and/or rights in property be condemned, appropriated, taken and damaged for the purpose of constructing the King County Correctional Facility, subject to the making or paying of just compensation to the owners thereof in the manner provided by law.
