ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of South 320th Street. Petitioner: Andrew C. Cratsenberg and Others V-1638

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of South 320th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and was advised that easements have been obtained.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. Public Funds were expended for acquisition of the vacation area and the County has maintained the roadway for over 10 years. Right of way would, therefore, be classified "Class A" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 5. The County Road Engineer and the County Traffic Engineer, concerned with the lack of roads in the rapidly developing commercial area situated north of South 320th Street and the Sea-Tac Mall, had several meetings with the owner and developers in the neighborhood. The engineers' concerns were based on proper roadway development to comply with King County traffic and design standards. The two engineers agreed to assist in the vacation of the unneeded right of way in the northerly portions of South 320th Street, provided that the necessary access roads were dedicated to King County and constructed in accordance with the traffic circulation needs.
- 6. The Department of Public Works recommends that consideration be given to the granting of the vacation at no cost due to improvements made to 20th Avenue South and costs on roads already

dedicated and constructed in the vicinity of the vacation area by the petitioner. The costs of these improvements more than offset the compensation due King County for the vacation.

- 7. It has been determined by the Real Property Division that the just compensation to be paid to King County pursuant to said Ordinance is \$9,350.00.
- 8. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road systems and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 2740 day of 990.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens to grant said petition, and that said petition be granted at no cost to the petitioner.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION I. The Council on the 27th day of May 1980, hereby vacates and abandons that portion of South 320th Street, described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the West line of West half of the West half of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 9, Township 21 North, Range 4 East, W.M., in King County, Washington, with the North line of the South 50.00 feet of said West half of the West half; thence Northerly along said West line 20.00 feet to a line parallel with and 70.00 feet Northerly, measured at right angles from the centerline of said South 320th Street, thence Easterly along said North line 145.78 feet; more or less to a point opposite Highway Engineer's Station 14+50; thence Northerly at right angles, 30.00 feet; thence Easterly, parallel with said centerline, 150.00 feet, more or less to a point opposite Highway Engineer's Station 16+00; thence Southerly at right angles 30.00 feet; thence Easterly 30.00 feet, more or less to the East line of said West half of the West half; thence Southerly along said East line 20.00 feet to the North line of said South 50.00 feet; thence Westerly along said North line to point of beginning.

	The vacation area contains approximately 11,000 square feet.
