ORDINANCE NO. 4950

AN ORDINANCE revising Housing and Community Development block grant allocations and amending Ordinance No. 4597, Section 7.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4597, Section 54, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

From the Community Development Block Grant Fund there is hereby appropriated: \$6,535,219

PROVIDED THAT:

- 1) The unexpended appropriation of the program and Section 312 administration elements of the Community Development Block Grant shall be recaptured at the end of each calendar year and become available for reallocation to other projects.
- 2) The Executive Proposed H&CD 1980 Block Grant Program (Attachment 2) is adopted with the following additions and deletions:

Vashon Island Accessibility Project: This project shall be managed by the Division of Parks and shall be contingent upon denial of Federal and State grants for handicapped accessibility projects.

Northshore Multi-Service Center: \$107,480 shall be committed to this project from 1981 program year funds.

Bear Creek Athletic Facility: \$100,000 shall be committed to this project from 1981 program year funds.

Housing for YES: \$70,000 shall be committed to this project from 1981 funds contingent upon securing adequate additional financial commitments from the cities of Kirkland and Redmond.
