ORDINANCE NO. 5092

AN ORDINANCE relating to the merger of King County Water District No. 113 into Summit Sewer District and declaring an emergency.

## STATEMENT OF FACT:

- 1. A notice of intention proposing the merger of King County Water District No. 113 into Summit Sewer District was filed with the County Council effective September 3, 1980.
- 2. King County Water District No. 113 and Summit Sewer District have both approved the merger agreement.
- 3. Summit Sewer District filed a Declaration of Nonsignificant Impact dated September 4, 1980, on the proposed merger.
- 4. The County Council held a public hearing on the 8th day of <u>Jeptember</u>, 1980, and has considered the criteria set forth in RCW 56.02.060.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The merger of King County Water District No. 113 into Summit Sewer District, and describe in Section 3 herein is approved subject to a special election to be held among the registered voters of King County Water District No. 113.

SECTION 2. Completion of this annexation does not constitute county approval or disapproval of any other permits, certifications, or actions necessary to provide service to this annexation area.

SECTION 3. The description for the combined corporate boundaries of King County Water District No. 113 and Summit Sewer District is as follows:

Commencing on the section line at the Northwest corner of Lot 3, Section 4, Township 22 North, Range 11 E.W.M., which is the point of beginning; thence South along the West line of Lot 3 extended to the Common boundary of King County and Kittitas County at the summit of the Cascade Range; thence easterly along said county boundary line to the East line of said Section 4; thence North on said line to the North section line of said Section 4; thence west on said section line to the point of beginning, all situate in King County, Washington.

A portion of Government Lot 7, Section 33, Township 23 North, Range 11 East W.M. consisting of a strip of land sixty feet in width the center line of which is described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of said Government Lot 7 said Southwest corner being a brass cap monument; thence South 65°51'52" East, 135.56 feet to another brass cap monument, being the Northwest corner of Government Lot 3 in Section 4, Township 22 North, Range 11 East W.M.; thence North 87°54'05" East 335.40 feet to the true point of beginning on the South line of Government Lot 7; thence North 3°28'30" East 1.37 feet; thence North 16°12'15" West, 134.24 feet; thence North 29°49'00" West, 268.28 feet; thence North 43°35'30" West, 82.80 feet; thence North 20°55'00" West, 57.27 feet; thence North 3°29'00" East, 280.90 feet; thence North 2°17'45" West, 396.43 feet; thence North 10°46'15" East, 220 feet more or less to the intersection point with the north line of said Government Lot 7.
