

ORDINANCE NO. 5120

AN ORDINANCE relating to the annexation of an area known as P-283R to Cascade Sewer District.

STATEMENT OF FACT:

1. A notice of intention proposing the annexation of an area known as P-283R to Cascade Sewer District was filed with the County Council September 2, 1980.

2. Cascade Sewer District has found the petition for annexation to be sufficient and has, by Resolution No. 1222 concurred with the proposed annexation.

3. Cascade Sewer District filed a Declaration of Nonsignificant Impact dated March 20, 1980, on the proposed annexation.

4. The County Council held a public hearing on the 29th day of September, 19 80, and has considered the criteria set forth in RCW 56.02.060.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1 The annexation by Cascade Sewer District of the area known as P-283R and described in Section 3 herein is approved.

SECTION 2. Completion of this annexation does not constitute county approval or disapproval of any other permits, certifications, or actions necessary to provide service to this annexation area.

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SECTION 3. The area known as P-283R to be annexed is described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of the Northeast quarter of Section 21, Township 22 North, Range 5 East, W.M., in King County, Washington, said point being on the existing boundary of Cascade Sewer District;

Thence Easterly along the North line of said Northeast quarter to the West line of the East 185 feet thereof;

Thence Southerly along said West line to the North line of the Southeast quarter of said Northeast quarter;

Thence Westerly along said North line to the Northwest corner of said Southeast quarter;

Thence Southerly along the West line of said Southeast quarter to the South line of said Northeast quarter;

Thence Westerly along the South line of said Northeast quarter to the Southwest corner thereof;

Thence Northerly along the West line of said Northeast quarter of the Northwest corner thereof and the true point of beginning.

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2 A MOTION requesting the County Executive to
3 immediately conduct a Special Training Course
4 on Physical Restraint Techniques for King
5 County Jail corrections personnel, and to
6 report to the Council on the establishment
7 of an enhanced regular Jail Personnel Train-
8 ing Program, to be administered by the
9 Personnel Division.

10 WHEREAS, extreme concern has been voiced over the living
11 and working conditions in the King County Jail, and for the
12 safety of jail inmates, jail staff, and visitors to the facility
13 by the local citizenry, members of the jail staff and of the
14 law, safety and justice community, and

15 WHEREAS, a primary concern has been the timing and method of
16 use of appropriate physical restraint techniques to effectively
17 control a prisoner without inflicting injury, and

18 WHEREAS, the misapplication of certain physical restraint
19 techniques can result in serious injury or death of the indi-
20 vidual being restrained, and

21 WHEREAS, further concern has been voiced regarding insuf-
22 ficient levels of training for full time and extra help
23 corrections personnel in jail procedures and in general corrections
24 skills,

25 NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED, by the King County Council

26 1. The County Executive is requested to conduct a special
27 program for corrections personnel on physical restraint techniques
28 specifically to include the hazards inherent in the application or
29 misapplication of various restraint procedures, to be administered
30 by the Personnel Division, utilizing the services of the Washington
31 State Criminal Justice Training Center or other consulting
32 expertise, whichever is most expeditious;

33 2. The County Executive is requested to review the existing
training activities for jail personnel, and to report by
January 30, 1981 on the implementation of an enhanced Jail

1 Staff Training Program, to be administered by the Personnel
2 Division.

3 The Jail Staff Training Program shall include the
4 following two major components, a regular program of training
5 administered to all jail personnel on a routine basis, and a
6 structured Initial Training Course for extra help personnel.

7 It is the intent of the Council that no personnel
8 shall serve in a regular or extra help capacity without complet-
9 ing the Initial Training Course.


10 The Council intends further that the enhanced Jail
11 Staff Training Program will emphasize the following:

- 12 - a review of individual personnel files to determine
- 13 specific training needs;
- 14 - "on site" training in the Jail Facility;
- 15 - a schedule of ongoing in-service courses;
- 16 - scheduling for weekend and evening attendance;
- 17 - the full range of corrections skills including
- 18 emergency medical health care screening procedures,
- 19 and security responsibilities as recognized in the
- 20 training curriculum of the Washington State Criminal
- 21 Justice Training Center.

22 3. The Executive is requested to transmit an appropriations
23 ordinance for sufficient funds to implement the Special Training
24 Course on Physical Restraint Techniques and for on ongoing Jail
25 Personnel Training Program.
