ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to Forward Thrust Park Resolution No. 34571 finding a certain project to be impractical to complete and therefore deleting said project and transferring funds from said project to another designated project and amending Ordinance No. 3977, Sections 2, 3, and 4, as amended.

#### PREAMBLE:

King County Resolution No. 34571 (hereinafter "Resolution") was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners (now the King County Council and the King County Executive) on December 18, 1967 and is commonly referred to as the Forward Thrust Park Bond Resolution.

This Resolution was approved by the voters of King County on February 13, 1968. The voters authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of the development and improvement of public park and recreation facilities all within King County by the various cities and towns in King County.

Public park and recreation facilities that are contemplated by the Resolution and defined therein mean any land, interest in land and facilities thereon within the County set aside for public park, recreational, greenbelt, arboretum, historic, scenic, viewpoint, aesthetic ornamental or natural resource preservation purposes. Projects described in Section 3 of the Resolution hereinafter "projects" assigned to the County were based in whole or in part upon input from citizens, civic organizations, public officials and 30 cities and towns in King County.

Section 5 of the Resolution provides in part that if the King County legislative authority (hereinafter "legislative authority or Council") shall then determine the conditions occurred which makes it impractical to substantially complete a project by reason of cost substantially in excess of the amount of bond proceeds estimated to be applied thereto that the County shall not be required to accomplish such project and may apply the funds as provided in Section 6 of the Resolution. The legislative authority desires to specify a project which is impractical to complete as contemplated by the Resolution. The legislative authority further desires to approve the transfer of funds from the deleted project to another designated project for further expansion and improvement of that project.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings. The Council hereby finds that the below described project is impractical to substantially accomplish because acquisition cost of the project substantially exceeds the amount of bond proceeds estimated to be applied thereto.

SECTION 2. Based upon the findings of Section 1 the Council hereby finds that bond proceeds have been made available and further the Council finds that completion of a previously designated Forward Thrust project described below can be accomplished with such funds and that such project is consistent with the Resolution and for a County purpose therefore it is hereby specified, ratified and approved to expend such bond proceeds to complete the following projects:

SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 3977, Section 3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Findings. The Council hereby finds the following facts that cause certain Projects to be impractical to substantially accomplish. (The amount of Resolution authorized bond proceeds is displayed only once):

- A. Conditions Changed by Actions of Superior Governmental Authorities:
- 1. After passage of the Resolution, the State Department of Ecology, pursuant to authority granted it by the Shoreline Management Act of 1971, RCW 90.58, appealed King County's issuance of permits to construct a boat launch at Seahurst Park. The Shoreline Hearings Board reversed the decision to issue permits, thereby making the following Project impractical of completion:

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L(4) Seahurst Park Boat Launching Ramps \$ 166,000

Development of two ramps at the extreme south end of park, to include dredging for boat access, placement of extensive riprap and construction of parking facilities.

2. After passage of the Resolution, the City of Normandy Park, pursuant to rights granted such cities in Section 4 of the Resolution, disapproved of the following Project thereby making it impractical of completion:

# K(4) Puget Sound Boulevard, Shoreline and Marine View Improvements \$ 1,800,000

Landscaping improvements and construction of approximately 10 view points along the Marine View Scenic Drive between Alki Beach Park and Dash Point State Park. (King County)

## B. Other Conditions Making Project Completions Impractical:

After passage of the Resolution, an engineering feasibility study concluded that the Federal Way Park Project (former landfill site) should not be developed because of unstable soil conditions, contaminated ground water and decomposition resulting in gas generation, thereby making the Project impractical of completion:
