ORDINANCE NO. 5232

AN ORDINANCE adopting the 1981 Annual Budget and making appropriations for the operation of County agencies and departments and capital improvements for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1981, and ending December 31, 1981.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The 1981 Annual Budget is hereby adopted and subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth and the several amounts hereinafter specified or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, appropriations are hereby authorized to be distributed for salaries, wages and other expenses of the various agencies and departments of King County, for capital improvements, and for other specified purposes for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1981, and ending December 31, 1981, out of the several funds of the County hereinafter named and set forth in the following sections.

SECTION 2. Within fund appropriations are sums to cover merit pay and labor settlements. The County Executive is authorized to distribute the required portion of these funds among the affected positions in each operating fund effective January 1, 1981. In the event cost-of-living adjustments are greater than funding provided, all budgets shall be augmented as required from funds available to the County not otherwise appropriated; provided that an ordinance shall be forwarded to the Council appropriating said funds by division.

- In presenting the 1982 program, all Division positions shall be centrally based and project- or activity-funded supporting staff positions are identified, as well as any loans of administrative staff to specific projects or activities.
- The Division of Housing and Community Development, in cooperation with the Planning Division, submit to the Council, no later than June 1, 1981, recommendations on updating the earmarking formula for the Block Grant regions. The update shall use the most recent data available from the 1980 census and the King County Land Development Information System. Furthermore, the update shall identify all areas eligible for the neighborhood support program within each census tract, and the criteria for designation as such.

- C. No later than December 15, 1980, the County Executive shall prepare and propose to the County Council an ordinance to establish a Solid Waste Capital Equipment Reserve Fund including a statement of the general purpose of the fund and general policy governing the use of the fund in the areas of fund administration, budgeting, and accounting.
- D. No later than January 31, 1981, the County Executive shall prepare operating procedures to insure the proper administrative implementation of the policies governing the use of the fund. These procedures will detail the methods and responsibilities related to:
- Appropriation of funds in the operating fund for transfer to the equipment reserve fund;
- 2. Transfer of funds from the operating fund to the equipment reserve fund on a monthly or quarterly basis;
- 3. Investment of equipment reserve funds with all interest earnings including those from cash balance, to be retained in the fund;
- 4. Appropriation procedures and guidelines in accordance with County Capital Improvement Program procedures; and,
- 5. Definition of potential constraints that may be placed on the use of the fund.
- E. The County Executive shall prepare and propose an ordinance to establish a new capital fund to insure positive accountability of interest earnings and expenditures of the 1981 CIP bond proceeds.
- F. The County Executive shall prepare the Solid Waste CIP ordinance to direct that all interest earnings including those from cash balances be transferred to the Solid Waste debt service bond redemption expenditure element of the Debt Service Fund for retirement of the bonds.
- G. All funds set aside for equipment replacement shall be maintained and utilized only for the purpose of replacing

equipment. Whereas Solid Waste rates have been based on crediting interest income to these reserves, all interest income accruing from the investment of these equipment replacement reserve funds shall be credited to the equipment replacement reserve. The intent is to maintain the financial ability of this account to replace equipment according to the schedule which underlies the proposed rates and not to use equipment replacement funds for other purposes.

- H. All Solid Waste funds shall be invested for the benefit of only the Solid Waste operation and not be credited to the Current Expense Fund or any other fund of the County.
- I. The Solid Waste Division with support of the Budget Division review alternatives for expanding service hours at various transfer stations including Bow Lake Transfer Station with the intent of attracting greater tonnages and expanding capacity in a cost effective fashion. This review, its findings and conclusions, and an implementation plan shall be submitted to the County Council no later than June 31, 1981.

SECTION 70. STADIUM OPERATING - From the Stadium Operating

Fund there is hereby appropriated: \$ 6,600,512
