AN ORDINANCE approving the Comprehensive Water Distribution System for the Nob Hill Water Company.

## PREAMBLE:

On October 9, 1980, the Nob Hill Water Company submitted a request to the Utilities Technical Review Committee as required by KCC 6.27.050, for a renewal of its franchise.

The Nob Hill Water Company does not have an approved comprehensive plan that KCC 6.27.060 requires as a prerequisite to granting a franchise.

On December 1, 1980, King County filed a Final Declaration of Non-Significance for the approval of the Comprehensive Water Distribution System.

On October 22, 1980, the Utilities Technical Review Committee considered the submitted plans and recommended that they be approved as a comprehensive plan, after making the following findings:

- 1. The Nob Hill Water Company is a Class II water sytem that provides domestic and fire flow service to approximately 32 residential and commercial customers in the greater Maple Valley Area.
- 2. On October 20, 1975, Council Motion #2198 granted a franchise to the Nob Hill Water Company for a term of five (5) years.
- 3. The Nob Hill Water Company is presently operating without a franchise.
- 4. The public health and welfare of the citizens of greater Maple Valley are endangered if maintenance of the water system cannot be provided within County rights-of-way.
- 5. The submitted plans satisfy the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services plan content guidelines for a comprehensive plan for a water purveyor that serves less than 100 hook-ups.

6. The system cannot meet the fire flow standards required by KCC 17.08.060. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: SECTION 1. The Nob Hill Water Company Comprehensive Plan, dated March 15, 1975 (attached), is hereby approved. INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 1940 day of \_\_, 19<u>8/</u>.
