## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of N.E. 190th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and was advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of the proposed vacation area.
- 4. The Division of Building and Land Development recommends that a portion of the vacation area be retained for open space. Upon approval of the vacation, an additional 30,000 square feet of land will be added to the existing open space area.
- 5. No public funds have been expended for acquisition, construction or maintenance of the vacation area and it is therefore classified "Class C" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 6. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of the vacation area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 17th day of Gebrusy, 1981
