AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of 30th Avenue South and Alleys lying within Blocks 5 and 6, and Lots 1 through 13, 30, 31 and 32 of the Plat of East Tacoma Central Addition, Block 6. Petitioner: Richard A. Mitchell - Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and Others. V-1698

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 30th Avenue South and Alleys lying within Blocks 5 and 6, and Lots 1 through 13, 30, and 32 of the Plat of East Tacoma Central Addition, Block 6, hereinafter described:
- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been notified that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development, after studying the proposed vacation, recommended that it would not be in the public interest to approve the vacation of only 30th Avenue South and not the lots it was intended to serve. This is due to the fact that these lots are still recognized by King County as legal building lots. As such, the subject portion of 30th Avenue South is still necessary. The Division recommended that the proposed vacation request be remanded back to the applicant to revise the petition to include both the lots and the street. The Division had no objection to the vacation of the subject alleys as it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- The Department of Public Works concurs with the recommendation and has discussed the proposed amendment with the petitioner, Richard A. Mitchell/Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, who has provided the Department with a letter, dated October 2, 1980, requesting vacation of the lots and street in questions.
- 5. The legal description furnished on the petition has been revised to include the lot lines as recommended by the Division of Building and Land Development and the Department of Public Works.
- The vacation area contains approximately 42,500 square feet of right of way and is a portion of the plat of East Tacoma Central Addition which was recorded on October 28, 1889. The Department of Public Works has found no

records to indicate that public funds have been expended for the acquisition or maintenance of the vacation area. Right of way would, therefore, be classified "C Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759 and no additional compensation is required.

7. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 17th day of February, 1981.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Council on the 17th day of February, 1981, hereby vacates and abandons the portion of 30th Avenue South and Alleys lying within Blocks 5 and 6, described as follows:

In the plat of East Tacoma Central Addition, as recorded in Volume 4 of Plats, page 26, Records of King County, Washington, vacate that westerly, 70 feet in width, portion of 30th Avenue South, also known as "A" Street, not previously vacated, lying East of Block 6; ALSO all of the 20 foot alley within Block 6; ALSO all of the 20 foot alley within Block 5; ALSO vacate all of Lots 1 through 13 in Block 6; ALSO all of Lots 30, 31 and 32 in Block 6.

Vacation area contains approximately 42,500 square feet.
