

ORDINANCE NO. 5373

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AN ORDINANCE relating to the Board of Corrections established within the Division of Corrections, amending Ordinance No. 2935, Sec. 3 and K.C.C. 2.32.110.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 2935, Section 3, and King County Code 2.32.110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Board of Corrections established. (a) There is established a board of corrections, hereinafter referred to as the board, consisting of (~~thirteen~~) fourteen members. The members shall consist of the following (~~or-a-designated-representative~~): the chairman of the King County magistrate's association, the presiding judge of the Seattle Municipal Court, the presiding judge of the King County Superior Court, the chairman of the juvenile court management committee, the director of King County Department of Public Safety, the administrator of the King County office of public defense, the King County prosecuting attorney, the mayor of the city of Seattle, the president of the King County Suburban Mayors' Association, the chief of the Seattle Police Department, the dean of the University of Washington School of Law, the dean of the University of Washington School of Social Work, and the director of the King County Health Department. In addition, the King County executive shall appoint one member who has been incarcerated in a King County detention facility within three years prior to the appointment. The director of the Department of Rehabilitative Services shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member.

(b) The board shall serve as an advisory body to the manager of the Division of Corrections to review and make recommendations at least annually for the Division of Corrections on its policies, operations and matters of budget.




