AN ORDINANCE providing for the correction of errors to the 1981 adopted budget, amending Ordinance No. 5232, Sections 41, 42, 44, 47, as amended, 52, 54, 60, 63, 64, 69, 71, and 73, and adding a new section to Ordinance No. 5232.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 5232, Section 44 is hereby amended to read as follows:

PROVIDED THAT:

A. No more than 420 FTE's shall be budgeted for the County Roads Fund.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 5232, Section 47, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

From the Public Health Pooling Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

PROVIDED THAT:

B. 1982 and 1983 Solid Waste Rates be reviewed in 1981 and 1982 to reflect decreases or increases justified by unplanned deviations in tonnage or inflation.

- C. No later than January 15, 1981, the County Executive shall prepare and propose to the County Council an ordinance to establish a Solid Waste Capital Equipment Reserve Fund including a statement of the general purpose of the fund and general policy governing the use of the fund in the areas of fund administration, budgeting and accounting.
- D. No later than January 31, 1981, the County Executive shall prepare operating procedures to insure the proper administrative implementation of the policies governing the use of the fund. These procedures will detail the methods and responsibilities related to:
 - 1. Appropriation of funds in the operating fund for transfer to the equipment reserve fund;
 - 2. Transfer of funds from the operating fund to the equipment reserve fund on a monthly or quarterly basis;
 - 3. Investment of equipment reserve funds with all interest earnings including those from cash balance, to be retained in the fund;
 - 4. Appropriation procedures and guidelines in accordance with County Capital Improvement Program procedures; and,
 - 5. Definition of potential constraints that may be placed on the use of the fund.
- E. The County Executive shall prepare and propose an ordinance to establish a new capital fund to insure positive accountability of interest earnings and expenditures of the 1981 CIP bond proceeds.
- F. The County Executive shall prepare the Solid Waste CIP ordinance to direct that all interest earnings including those from cash balances be transferred to the Solid Waste debt service bond redemption expenditure element of the Debt Service Fund for retirement of the bonds.
- G. All funds set aside for equipment replacement shall be maintained and utilized only for the purpose of replacing equipment. Whereas Solid Waste rates have been based on crediting interest income to these reserves, all interest income accruing from the investment of these equipment replacement reserve funds shall be credited to the equipment replacement reserve. The intent is to maintain the financial ability of this account to replace equipment according to the schedule which underlies the proposed rates and not to use equipment replacement funds for other purposes.
- H. All Solid Waste funds shall be invested for the benefit of only the Solid Waste operation and not be credited to the Current Expense Fund or any other fund of the County.
- I. The Solid Waste Division with support of the Budget Division review alternatives for expanding service hours at various transfer stations including Bow Lake Transfer Station with the intent of attracting greater tonnages and expanding capacity in a cost effective fashion. This review, its findings and conclusions, and an implementation plan shall be submitted to the County Council no later than June 30, 1981.

SECTION 10. Ordinance No. 5232, Section 71 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Dear Councilman Barden:

Attached please find Ordinance No. 5391 which I have approved with the exception of the object of expense contained in Section 15 which I have vetoed under the authority of Section 230.20 of the Charter.

As identified in the most repent quarterly budget report transmitted to the Council, extraordinary expenses for labor settlements, jail population reduction and other items may cause an operating deficit in the Current Expense Fund in 1981. Under these circumstances, I do not believe that it is appropriate to expend additional funds for this non-mandatory program.

I am advised by the Prosecuting Attorney that the effect of this partial voto is to retain the funding level for the Office of Agriculture at the amount established by Ordinance #5232.
