AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of 118th Avenue N.E., 119th Avenue N.E. and Connecting Alley
Petitioner: Sara L. Rychlik (H.G. Goldsmith & Assoc.) and Others. V-1678

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 118th Avenue N.E., 119th Avenue N.E. and connecting alley, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principals and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The Division of Building and Land Development recommends that consideration be given to the inclusion of Lots 1-15, Block 7, of the Kirkland Steel Works Plat in the subject vacation request since said lots are legal building lots and the proposed vacation would negate legal access to them. The Department of Public Works concurs with this recommendation.
- 5. The Department of Public Works, in the course of their investigation, discovered that vacation of the northerly portion of Pittsburg Avenue (118th Avenue N.E.) as described in the petition description would deny the useable access to an affected property owners lots and have deleted that portion from the vacation.
- 6. The Department of Public Works also recommends that the east-west cross streets (N.E. 74th Street and N.E. 73rd Street) as described in the petition description be deleted from the

vacation.

7. The legal description furnished on the petition has been revised to include Lots 1-15, Block 7, of the Kirkland Steel Works Plat and to retain the northerly portion of Pittsburg Avenue (118th Avenue N.E.) and the east-west cross streets (N.E. 74th Street and N.E. 73rd Street) as recommended by the Division of Building and Land Development, the Department of Public Works and the Real Property Division.

- 8. The vacation area is a portion of the plat of Kirkland Steel Works Addition to Kirkland recorded on June 24, 1890. The Department of Public Works has found no evidence to indicate that public funds have been expended for the acquisition or maintenance of the roads described herein. Right of way would, therefore, be classified "C" Class in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 9. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right-of-way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 13th day of ________, 19_8/___.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Council on the 13th day of Ogral, 1961, hereby vacates and abandons the portions of 118th Avenue N.E., 119th Avenue N.E. and connecting alley, described as follows:

That portion of East Pittsburgh Avenue (118th Avenue N.E.) 1 60 feet in width, lying southerly of the easterly extension of the North line of Block 2 and northerly of the South 2 margin of Lake Street EXCEPT that portion lying within a 45 foot radius circle, the center point of which is the 3 intersection of the centerline of said East Pittsburgh Avenue and the centerline of Baxter Street (N.E. 74th Street) and EXCEPT that portion lying within the 60 foot right of way of Butler Street (N.E. 73rd Street); ALSO that portion of Houghton Street (119th Avenue N.E.), 25 feet in width, lying southerly of the easterly extension of the North line of Block 8: ALSO the alley adjoining said Block 8 and 7; ALSO vacate all of lots 6 7 1 through 15 in Block 7; all as shown on the plat of 8 Kirkland Steel Works Addition to Kirkland as recorded in Volume 6 of Plats, page 25, records of King County, 9 Washington.
