ORDINANCE NO. 5427

AN ORDINANCE approving the Comprehensive Sewerage Plan for the City of Kent.

PREAMBLE:

In January 1981, the City of Kent issued the Final Environmental Impact Statement for the City of Kent Comprehensive Sewerage Plan.

On February 2, 1981, the City of Kent passed Resolution No. 915, and adopted its comprehensive sewerage plan dated December 1980.

On February 23, 1981, the proposed comprehensive sewerage plan was submitted for review by the Utilities Technical Review Committee, as required by KCC 13.24. On March 11, 1981, the Committee recommended that it be approved by the Council.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The City of Kent Comprehensive Sewerage Plan, dated December 1980 (attached) is hereby approved subject to the following provisions:

- a. Sewer service shall be provided only within the Local Service Area, or as otherwise provided by the King County Sewerage General Plan; and

b. Sewer collection systems shall be designed in accordance with the standards detailed in the plan and shall not require individual additions and betterments approval by King County.
