AN ORDINANCE adopting the Uniform Fire Code, 1979 Edition, for King County together with amendments, amending Ordinance 3660, Sections 1, 2, 4, and 7 and K.C.C. 17.04.010, 17.04.030, 17.04.050; and repealing Ordinance 3660, Sections 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and K.C.C. 17.04.060, 17.04.090, 17.04.100, 17.04.110, 17.04.120, 17.04.130.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of King County:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 3660, Section 1, and K.C.C. 17.04.010 are each amended to read as follows:

The Uniform Fire Code (1976) 1979 Edition, as published by the Western Fire Chiefs Association and the International Conference of Building Officials (including Appendices A through (6) 1), together with amendments, additions, and deletions listed in this chapter is adopted as the Fire Code of King County, and hereinafter referred to as "this Code".

SECTION 2. Ordinance 3660, Section 2 and K.C.C. 17.04.030 are amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, SECTION (1-203) 2.103, FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU, is hereby repealed and the following is substituted: SEC-TION ($\frac{1.293}{2.103}$. ESTABLISHMENT AND DUTIES OF BUREAU OF FIRE PREVENTION. For the purpose of this Code the Bureau of Fire Prevention in the Building and Land Development Division of King County shall be operated under the supervision of the Fire Marshal, Building and Land Development Division, Department of Planning and Community Development, and shall enforce the fire prevention provisions and shall have authority in a fire department or fire district in the performance of duties connected with this Code. The Bureau of Fire Prevention may assume an advisory status in the matters of operation, function, expenditure, tactics, personnel and equipment or any other function as the fire district sees fit to request. The fire suppression and tactical provisions may be enforced by the Chief of a fire department or fire district. Chief of a fire department or fire district, acting under the

supervision of the Board of Fire Commissioners in that district and in coordination with the Bureau of Fire Prevention, may perform the duties specified in the Uniform Fire Code within the geographical boundaries of that fire protection district, to the full extent required by the Bureau of Fire Prevention.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 3660, Section 4 and K.C.C. 17.04.050 are amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE, SECTION (1-215) 2.302 "BOARD OF APPEALS," is amended to read as follows: In order to determine the suitability of alternate materials or methods of construction, and to provide for reasonable interpretation of the provisions of this code, there shall be and is hereby created a Fire Prevention Advisory and Appeals Board, consisting of seven members who are qualified by experience and training in fire protection to pass upon perti-The Fire Marshal shall be an ex officio member and shall act as Secretary of the Board. The Fire Prevention Advisory and Appeals Board shall be appointed by the County Executive, confirmed by the Council, and shall serve for a two-year term or until their successor is appointed and qualified. Initially four members shall be appointed to a two-year term and three members to a The Board shall adopt reasonable rules and regulaone-year term. tions for conducting its investigations and shall render all decisions and findings in writing to the Fire Marshal with a duplicate copy to the appellant and may recommend to the County Council such new legislation as is consistent therewith.

SECTION 4. Ordinance 3660, Section 5 and K.C.C. 17.04.060 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Ordinance 3660, Section 6 and K.C.C. 17.04.070 are each amended to read as follows: A new ((division,-Division)) article, Article 5, is hereby added to the Uniform Fire Code, ARTICLE ((1)) 5, GENERAL PROVISIONS, as follows:

32 ((DIVISION-V)) ARTICLE 5. Section ((1-501)) 5.101 VIOLATION PROVISIONS.

Notwithstanding any specific remedies enumerated in the text of

codes adopted by reference in this document or other regulations herein adopted; violation, or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, shall subject the offender, upon conviction thereof, to a fine of not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), or imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both, and each day that such violation or failure to comply exists shall constitute a separate offense. The prosecutor may, as an alternative to criminal action, seek legal or equitable relief to enjoin or abate any violation of the laws incorporated by reference herein.

Section ((1.502)) 5.102. CIVIL PENALTY APPEAL. In addition to or as an alternate to any judicial or administrative remedy provided herein or by law, any person, firm, corporation or organization violating any of the provisions of this Code, or by each act of commission or omission procures, aids or abets such violation, shall incur a cumulative civil penalty in the amount of three dollars per day, per each violation, plus billable costs of the Building and Land Development Division, Department of Planning and Community Development, from the date set for compliance until such violation is corrected or such notice of violation is complied with. All civil penalties and appeals will be enforced in accordance with the procedures specified in K.C.C. Title 23, Enforcement.

SECTION 6. Ordinance 3660, Section 7 and K.C.C. 17.04.080 are each amended to read as follows:

UNIFORM FIRE CODE ((ARTHELE-12)) ARTICLE 78, FIREWORKS, is hereby repealed. (For control of fireworks see K.C.C. 6.26.)

SECTION 7. Ordinance 3660, Section 8 and K.C.C. 17.04.090 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. Ordinance 3660, Section 9 and K.C.C. 17.04.100 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. Ordinance 3660, Section 10 and K.C.C. 17.04.110 are hereby repealed.
