
STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of the Old Woodinville-Duvall Road, County Road No. 1056, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The vacation area is a portion of the old Woodinville-Duvall Road, County Road No. 1056, which was established March 15, 1915. The vacation portion was acquired at no monetary costs to the County, however, County funds have been expended in the improvement and maintenance of the road prior to the realignment in 1932. We classify the vacation area "B Class" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759. King County is now in receipt of \$833.00 and a Quit Claim Deed for a 7000 square foot area adjoining the current Woodinville-Duvall Road. This amount has been judged to be fair compensation for that portion of the original proposed vacation lying Westerly of the centerline from the property owner adjoining that portion. The property owner adjoining the Easterly portion of the right of way has expressed no desire to acquire the remainder for the amount established by the Real Property Division. The Department of Public Works recognizes this and has agreed to proceed with a vacation of that portion for which compensation has been received.
- 5. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County Road System and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, 2 the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: SECTION 1.
