ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to levying the property taxes of King County for the year 1982.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The County Assessor of King County has certified to the County Council that the assessed valuation of the County of King as finally equalized amounts to \$47,647,649,084 and as adjusted for senior citizen exemptions provided for in RCW 84.36.381, for 20% only of watercraft in accordance with RCW 84.36.090, and for omitted assessments in accordance with RCW 84.40.080 is \$46,779,215,003.

SECTION 2. The Council of King County, Washington, finds that the levies necessary to fund estimated expenditures for the year 1982, less the total of estimated revenues from sources other than taxation, including available surplus and such expenditures as are to be met from bond warrant issues, be and the same are hereby fixed as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 5746

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of S.E. 43rd Street Petitioner: Leroy R. Ellis and Others V-1721

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of S.E. 43rd Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The vacation area contains a structure which projects into a County right of way. This proposed vacation will clear that structure from the County right of way. The road was constructed as an RID and is County maintained. Therefore, the right of way is classified as class "B" and additional compensation is required in accordance with Ordinance No. 2759. King County is now in receipt of \$340.00 from the petitioner which has been judged to be just compensation for this vacation area.
- 5. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 9th day of Navember, 1981.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Council on the god day of Rouseller, 1981 hereby vacates and abandons the portion of S 43rd Street described as follows:

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Beginning at the Southwest corner of Lot 7, St. Francis Wood, as recorded in Volume 86 of Plats, pages 17 and 18, records of King County, Washington: thence North 68 33'55" East along the South line of said Lot 7 a distance of 111 feet to the true point of beginning, thence continuing Northeasterly along said South line a distance of 34 feet, thence South 68033'55" Most a distance of 34 feet. of 7.5 feet, thence South  $68^{\circ}33'55"$  West a distance of 34 feet; thence Northwesterly to the true point of beginning. The vacation area contains approximately 255 square feet.
