On March 11, 1981, Water District 108 adopted Resolution No. 1613 concurring with the Threshold Determination of Non-Significance for Fire District No. 43 Water Service Project.

The Utilities Technical Review Committee reviewed the proposed amendment as required by KCC 13.24 and Ordinance No. 4146 and on November 5, 1981, recommended its approval.

As required by Ordinance No. 4146, Section 1.3.(c), the Utilities Technical Review Committee has found that the facilities are necessary to serve public facilities. In addition, the proposed facilities are necessary to solve an existing fire safety problem.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

The amendment to the Water District 108 Plan as SECTION 1. adopted by District Resolution No. 1673 (attached) is found to be consistent with the provisions of Ordinance No. 4146, and is hereby approved.
