ORDINANCE NO. 5800

AN ORDINANCE standardizing the civil penalty for violations of the Uniform Fire Code, amending Ordinance 5484, Section 5, Ordinance 3660, Section 6 and King County Code 17.04.070.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 5484, Section 5, Ordinance 3660, Section 6 and King County Code 17.04.070 are each hereby amended as follows:

A new article, Article 5, is hereby added to the Uniform Fire Code, ARTICLE 5, GENERAL PROVISIONS, as follows:

ARTICLE 5. Section 5.101 VIOLATION PROVISIONS. Notwithstanding any specific remedies enumerated in the text of codes adopted by reference in this document or other regulations herein adopted; violation, or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, shall subject the offender, upon conviction thereof, to a fine of not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), or imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both, and each day that such violation or failure to comply exists shall constitute a separate offense. The Prosecutor may, as an alternative to criminal action, seek legal or equitable relief to enjoin or abate any violation of the laws incorporated by reference herein.


Section 5.102. CIVIL PENALTY APPEAL. In addition to or as an alternate to any judicial or administrative remedy provided herein or by law, any person, firm, corporation or organization violating any of the provisions of this Code, or by each act of commission or omission procures, aids or abets such violation, shall incur a cumulative civil penalty (~~in the amount of three dollars per day, per each violation, plus billable costs of the Building and Land Development Division, Department of Planning and Community Development, from the date set for compliance until such violation is corrected or such notice of violation is complied with.~~ All civil penalties and appeals will be

2 provided in K.C.C. Title 23, Enforcement.


