STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 204th Avenue N.E., hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were not required.
- 3. The Division of Building & Land Development studied the subject proposed road vacation and initially recommended that it be denied. However, they later reported as follows: "Upon request of the applicant, the Division of Building and Land Development has reviewed its previous recommendation on the above vacation petition. Accordingly, this Division finds it would have no objection to the vacation of 204th Avenue N.E. However, it is recommended that N.E. 108th remain in the public street system in order to provide for future improvement of neighborhood circulation.
- 4. The Department of Public Works concurs with the Division of Building & Land Development and recommends denying any vacation of N.E. 108th Street and do recommend vacating the 204th Avenue N.E. portion.
- 5. The vacation area, 204th Avenue N.E., was land reserved for a County road designated Peterson Road in the unrecorded plat named "Stromsland Tracts" in 1921. The westerly portion of 204th Avenue N.E. was vacated by King County Ordinance No. 2180 in 1974 (V-1466). We found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been opened as a road. A search of the records indicates that the County has spent no funds for its acquisition or maintenance. Right of way would therefore be classified "C Class" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 6. The Department of Public Works considers the remaining subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
