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ORDINANCE NO. 6039

AN ORDINANCE relating to voting precincts in King County, providing for the alteration, creation, division and name conversion of precincts; amending Ordinance 1276, Section 1 as amended, and K.C.C. 1.12.010, adding new sections, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 1276, Section 1, as amended, and K.C.C. 1.12.010, are hereby amended as follows:

Precincts established. Precincts shall be divided, boundaries of precincts shall be altered and new precincts shall be established, as set forth in ((Ordinance-1276-as-amended-by-Ordinance-1319-as-amended-by-Ordinance-1708-and)) the attachments attached ((t)) hereto and incorporated ((t)) herein and on file in the ((Department)) Division of Records and Elections.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. An alpha-numeric system of identifying voting precincts using a combination of letters and numbers shall be established throughout King County. Those precincts which currently have names shall retain such for public purposes. Names shall be given to those precincts developed from portions of existing named precincts. Names and newly named precincts are described in Attachment A affixed hereto. Those precincts which are currently numbered shall be given an alpha-numeric title which is described in Attachment B affixed hereto.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. Beginning in 1983, in conformance with State Law, all revisions to voting precincts shall be submitted to the Council for approval no later than May 1 of the applicable year; PROVIDED THAT, beginning in 1983, all voting precincts shall be so constructed so as to consist of between two hundred and four hundred registered voters per individual precinct; PROVIDED FURTHER THAT, proposed precincts less than

two hundred voter representation shall be noted and a full 1 explanation for the deviation will have been provided. 2 SECTION 4.
