AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of Willows Road N.E. Petitioner: Richard P. File and Others V-1705

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of Willows Road N.E., hereinafter described.
- 2. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 3. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and was advised that easements have been secured by Puget Sound Power and Light Company and General Telephone Company of the Northwest, Inc.
- 4. The vacation area is a portion of a right of way acquired for widening Willows Road N.E., which was a major plan for an arterial in 1968. The County Interim Transportation Plan (Focus 1990) no longer includes that portion of Willows Road N.E., north of N.E. 124th Street. The County has, and will continue, to maintain Willows Road N.E. in this area. Right of way would, therefore, be classified "B" Class in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759. King County is now in receipt of \$20,794.00 from the petitioner which has been judged to be the just compensation to King County for this vacation area.
- 5. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 24h day of 24y.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
