ORDINANCE NO. 6067

AN ORDINANCE relating to zoning; amending provisions relating to lot clustering and townhouses and adding a fee for modification of recorded building envelopes; and amending Ordinance 4687, Section 1, Ordinance 3144, Sections 2 and 8 (part), Ordinance 4667, Section 4, Ordinance 4689, Section 6, Ordinance 5331, Section 5, Ordinance 4304, Section 1, Ordinance 5786, Section 4, and KCC 21.08.020, 21.08.080, 21.17.040, 21.17.090, 21.48.270, and 21.62.050.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 4687, Section 1, Ordinance 3144, Section 2 and KCC 21.08.020 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Permitted uses - Primary residential. In an RS zone, the following residential uses only are permitted, subject to the off-street parking requirements and the general provisions and exceptions set forth in this title, beginning with ((Chapter)) K.C.C. 21.46, and subject to the provisions of the King County shoreline management master program where applicable:

- ((++)) A. A one-family dwelling;
- B. A two-family dwelling when the lot or building site upon which it is located has a side line abutting a lot or lots classified for RM-2400, RM-1800, RM-900, B, C or M purposes, whether or not an alley intervenes. In no case shall the property used for such two-family dwelling consist of more than one lot or exceed a width of ninety feet, whichever is the least, nor be used to a depth greater than the extent to which the side property line is common with property classified for such heavier uses:
- ((<del>(13)</del>)) <u>C.</u> Planned unit developments, as provided in Chapter 21.56;
- ((+4+)) D. A townhouse dwelling within a multiple lot subdivision or short subdivision subject to the following conditions:

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(((A))) 1. The area of each townhouse lot may be reduced below the minimum required by the zone, but the average lot area of the subdivision or short subdivision in which the townhouses are located must meet the minimum requirement, using the lot averaging provisions of ((Seetion )) KCC 21.08.050,

(((B))) 2. In addition to meeting all design, setback and site improvement requirements of the RT zone, proposed townhouse developments in an RS zone shall,

 $((\pm i\pm))$  <u>b.</u> A row of townhouse dwellings in an RS zone shall be no more than one hundred twenty feet long across its frontage without an intervening segment of side yards or common open space,

((fii))) c. Any lot at the end of a row of townhouse lots which is adjacent to a lot developed with a detached single-family dwelling shall have the same front yard setback as the detached dwelling, and shall have a minimum side yard of five feet. If the side of the townhouse structure is more than fifty feet long, an additional five feet of side yard per story shall be provided. When a townhouse lot is also a reverse corner lot, an additional ten feet of side yard shall be provided,

((+e+)) 3. When townhouses are proposed for an RS zoned area already platted into legal lots, the area must be resub-divided to meet the requirements of this section,

((+++)) 4. In order to assure correct placement of

buildings, construction of foundation forms, but no other structural elements, of townhouse dwellings or other residential structures with walls touching lot lines may commence prior to final plat or short plat approval, provided,

((+i+)) <u>a.</u> The proposed subdivision or short subdivision has received preliminary approval, all conditions have been met, and bonds are posted for improvements

 $((\{ii\}))$  <u>b.</u> Partial or complete construction of foundations shall not relieve the subdivider from, nor impair county enforcement of, conditions of subdivision or short subdivision approval

((fii)--Neither-units-ner)) c. No lots may be sold ((er-effered-fer-sale-until-final-plat-er-shert-plat-approval.)) in violation of the state subdivision act, RCW 58.17.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 4667, Section 4, Ordinance 3144, Section 8(part) and KCC 21.08.080 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Permissible lot coverage. (({a})) A. Except as otherwise provided for schools and churches, all buildings, including accessory buildings and structures, but not including any open areas used to provide parking spaces or private swimming pools, shall not cover more than thirty-five percent of the area of the lot. In the case of churches and schools, the limitation of lot coverage shall pertain to buildings and structures only and does not include open air parking areas.

((fb+)) B. In subdivisions or short subdivisions where lot averaging, lot clustering or flexible setback requirements of ((0rdinance-4304)) K.C.C. 21.48.270 are used, residential lot coverage shall be limited to thirty-five percent of the ((total-area-of-lots)) minimum lot area of the zone classification, except that the lot coverage provisions of the RT zone shall apply to lots developed with townhouses.

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SECTION 3. Ordinance 4689, Section 6 and KCC 21.17.040 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

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Forms of townhouse occupancy and conveyance. A. The RT classification is designed as a flexible tool to meet the needs of a variety of housing consumers and producers. townhouse developments may be built for renter occupancy of units on a site under one ownership, owner occupancy of units on a commonly owned site through condominium agreements pursuant to Chapter 64.32 RCW, or owner or renter occupancy of separately conveyed units on individual lots created through subdivision or short subdivision pursuant to Chapter 58.17 RCW. The requirements of this chapter apply regardless of the form of occupancy or ownership; the terms "lot" and "unit" are therefore interchangeable, depending on whether the site of a proposed townhouse development is to be subdivided or remain under one ownership. Similarly, "lot lines" shall connote common walls and the exterior boundaries of private open space attached to each unit when no subdivision or short subdivision is used. Townhouse condominium developments proposed with setback variations pursuant to ((0rdinance-4304)) K.C.C. 21.48.270 must be approved by means of a short subdivision.

- B. Construction of townhouse dwellings intended for separate conveyance through subdivision or short subdivision may commence prior to final plat or short plat approval, provided:
- 1. The proposed subdivision or short subdivision has received preliminary approval;
- 2. Partial or complete construction of structures shall not relieve the subdivider from, nor impair county enforcement of, conditions of subdivision or short subdivision approval;
- 3. Units ((may-not-be)) are not sold ((or-offered-for sale-unit-final-plat-or-short-plat-approval.)) in violation of the state subdivision act, RCW 58.17.

C. No subdivision or short subdivision of a site containing previously constructed townhouse dwellings shall be allowed unless all common walls meet building code and fire code requirements for separately owned dwellings.

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SECTION 4. Ordinance 5331, Section 5 and KCC 21.17.090 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Site improvement and design standards. In conditioning townhouse development approval, whether by subdivision or short subdivision review or by building permit review when the site remains commonly owned, the following shall be required, subject to administrative discretion when appropriate:

- A. Street Improvements. All streets and alleys, whether public or private, shall be designed and constructed in accordance with the adopted King County road standards codified in ((Ghapter-19+20-ef-this-eede)) K.C.C. 19.20.
- B. Drainage Controls. Surface water runoff shall be controlled in accordance with standards set forth in ((Ghapter 20-50-ef-this-eede)) K.C.C. 20.50.
- C. Landscaping. Landscaping shall be installed in accordance with the provisions set forth in ((Ghapter)) K.C.C 21.51. In addition, street trees, a minimum of ten feet or with a minimum trunk diameter of one and one-half inches, shall be planted not greater than thirty feet on-center. All trees shall be chosen and maintained in accordance with the provisions of ((Ghapter)) K.C.C. 21.51. The manager may waive or reduce this requirement when existing trees on the site can achieve substantially the same effect.
- D. Sidewalks or Walkways. Sideways or walkways shall be provided which:
  - 1. Are durable and serviceable;
  - 2. Provide direct access to each unit;
- 3. Are functionally and safely convenient to any community facilities or recreational areas within the site, and

to public streets and sidewalks adjacent to the site;

- 4. Are sufficiently wide to accommodate the projected use; and
- 5. Are separated from vehicular traffic by curbs, vegetation or other acceptable means.
- E. Orientation. The overall development plan for the site and orientation of individual units should reflect consideration of the microclimate of the site, by orientation to sun, shade and wind for increased energy efficiency of the development and for maximum comfort of the residents.
- F. Privacy. Each unit shall have reasonable visual and accoustical privacy; and opportunities for viewing of public areas and accessways should be considered in designing the development. Private, semiprivate and public areas should be clearly delineated by means of walls, fences, berms, landscaping or other acceptable means.
- G. Bulk and Setback Variation. Groups of townhouses with three or more units attached to each other, whether being conveyed together or separately, shall have at least a five-foot variation in the front ((yard)) facade on at least every third unit, or a five-foot "fin" extension of each common wall into the front yard, to help provide privacy and identity for each unit. In multiple lot subdivisions or short subdivisions, a plot plan of the entire row in which each unit is located shall be provided by the builder to show compliance with this requirement.

SECTION 5. Ordinance 4304, Section 1 and KCC 21.48.270 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Flexible yard and lot dimension requirements in subdivisions and short subdivisions. In subdivisions and short subdivisions proposed to create residential building lots within any R, S or G zone, required front, rear and side yard requirements and lot

dimensions may be varied from those required by the zone in which the proposed subdivision or short subdivision is situated, in order to provide more optimal use of private or community open space, privacy, or more energy-efficient arrangement of structures, or to protect environmentally sensitive areas provided:

((++)) A. Primary and accessory residential buildings, whether on the same lot or on adjacent lots, must either maintain a separation of not less than ten feet or share a common wall;

((+2+)) B. If a detached structure is proposed to be located ((teuching-a-let-line;)) within a normally required yard a ten-foot easement must be provided on the adjacent lot, said easement to be free of structures and other obstructions so as to allow painting, reroofing and other normal repair and maintenance of the structure's exterior. When structures are proposed to share a common wall on a lot boundary line, a plat covenant or condition of approval must be provided for necessary access to each adjacent lot to allow painting, reroofing and other normal repair and maintenance of each structure's exterior

must show the ((exact)) approximate size and location of all structures (i.e. building envelopes) proposed to be placed in an otherwise required yard or open space. ((Review-of-proposed-subsequent-additions-to-such-structures-shall-be-governed-by Section-21.52.050.--Any-structure-not-specifically-shown-on-the final-plat-or-short-plat-must-observe-all-normally-required-yards-and-setbacks;)) The manager may permit modifications of approved building envelopes for good cause. When the building envelope is to be located within a required yard the manager shall give notice to adjacent property owners and must allow fifteen (15) days for comments before making a decision.

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((+4+)) <u>D.</u> In no case shall a structure be located closer than the normally required side yard distance from the boundary of the proposed subdivision or short subdivision. This restriction may be waived by the County when an adjacent property has been developed under a planned unit development or under the provisions of this section, and the county has determined that no adverse impact on the adjacent property will result;

((+5+)) E. Eaves, but no other part of any structure, may protrude no more than eighteen inches across a side or rear lot line;

((+6+)) <u>F.</u> In order to preserve privacy between adjacent lots, when a residence is located within an otherwise required side or rear yard, there shall be no windows <u>, doors or mechanical vents in the walls facing the nearest lot lines</u>

((--No-doors-or-mechanical-vents-shall-be-installed-in-such-walls<sub>7</sub>)) except when such walls abut permanent open space or a public or private right-of-way;

((<del>f7</del>)) <u>G</u>. The setback flexibility allowed by this section shall not eliminate the vision requirements of ((Section))

<u>K.C.C.</u> 21.48.130 or any other county requirements relating to traffic safety at or near street intersections;

((+8+)) H. Average lot area and lot area per dwelling unit shall be as required in the zone in which the proposed subdivision or short subdivision is located;

((+9+)) I. All normal yard, open space and lot dimension requirements shall apply to lots proposed to be created through a subdivision or short subdivision unless King County determines that a proposed modification of normally required yards or lot dimensions is consistent with the purposes of this title and county subdivision regulations. King County shall deny or

modify any proposed variation from normally required yards or lot dimensions within a subdivision or short subdivision as necessary to accomplish the purposes of this title and the county's subdivision regulations, and to miminize adverse impacts on adjacent properties.

((\(\frac{10}{10}\)) J. Prior to selling any lot or residence in a subdivision or short subdivision which provides for flexible yard or lot dimension arrangements as allowed by this section, the seller shall show the prospective purchase a copy of the plat or short plat depicting the arrangement of lot lines and structures, and shall provide a clear written explanation of the provisions of this section to said prospective purchaser.

SECTION 6. Ordinance 5786, Section 4, Ordinance 4221, Section 1 and KCC 21.62.050 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Filing fees. The following fees shall be paid upon the filing of any application:

- A. Reclassification to:
- 1. RS, SR, SE, SC, G, G-5, AOU, A, FR, FP, RMHP, RD ... \$300 + \$25/acre ... Max. \$750.00.
- 2. RT, RM-2400, RM-1800 ... \$550 + \$25/acre ... Max. \$850.00.
- 3. RM-900, BN, BC, BR-C, BR-N ... \$750 + \$30/acre ... Max. \$1,100.
  - 4. CG, ML, MP, MH, QM ...\$800 + \$30/acre ... Max. \$1,200.
  - B. Unclassified Use Permits ... Max. \$1,000.
  - C. Planned Unit Developments ((+))
    - ((1:-Residential)) ... \$500 + \$50/acre ... Max. \$1,250.

If the planned unit development includes a request for reclassification, no fee will be required for the reclassification.
