Proposed Ordinance No. 222

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to zoning, deleting height limitations on hedges; and amending Ordinance 3292, Section 1, Resolution 25789, Section 2414, and KCC 21.48.160.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 3292, Section 1, Resolution 25789, Section 2414 and KCC 21.48.160 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Location of wall ((\_,)) or fence ((or-hedge)). In any R, S and A zones a wall ((\_,)) or fence ((or-hedge)) is permitted under the following conditions:

((+1+)) A. Where a fence ((ex-hedge)) is located directly on the ground, the height of the fence shall be the vertical distance from the top board, rail or wire to the ground directly below the fence; where a masonry wall is used as a fence, the height shall be the vertical distance from the top surface of the wall to the ground on the high side of the wall.

(((+2+)) B. In any zone a wall ((7)) or fence ((or-hedge)) not more than six feet in height may be located and maintained on any part of a lot; in any S or A zones, open mesh and wire fences not exceeding six feet in height may be located anywhere on the lot, provided ((+))

((A)--Where)) where a lot rears upon an alley any such wall  $((\tau))$  or fence ((or-hedge)) along the lot rear line shall contain a gate affording access to the alley  $((\tau))$ .

(((B)--No-wally-fence-or-hedge-shall be constructed Which creates a traffic safety hazard as determined by the King

Gounty-Department-of-Public Works.))

((+3+)) C. Where a retaining wall protecting a cut below the natural grade is located on the line separating lots or parcels, such retaining wall may be topped by a fence ((-7)) or wall ((-7)) of the same height that would otherwise be permitted at the location if no retaining wall existed, and the top of the retaining wall shall be considered the bottom of the fence;

(((4))) D. Where a retaining wall contains a fill, the height of the retaining wall built to retain the fill shall be considered as contributing to the permissible height of a wall ((,,)) or fence ((er-hedge)) and shall be measured from the ground on the low side, provided that in any event a protective fence not more than forty-two inches in height may be erected at the top of the retaining wall and any portion of such fence above the six foot maximum height shall be open-work fence; and open-work fence means a fence in which the component solid portions are evenly distributed and constitute not more than fifty percent of the total surface area at the face of the fence.

((45)) E. Electric fences shall not be permitted in any R zone.

((46+)) F. No fences shall be located in any public right-of-way.

(((7))) G. Any fence exceeding a height of six feet, and any retaining wall exceeding a height of forty-eight inches shall require a building permit; the provisions and conditions of this section shall not apply to fences required by state law
