ORDINANCE NO. 6114

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of 12th Place South and South 199th Street Petitioner: Clinton D. Griffith and Others V-1763

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 12th Place South and South 199th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the areas and has been advised that easements were not required.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The vacation area is a portion of Seeley's Addition to the City of Des moines, which was recorded on December 17, 1889. No evidence was found that the vacation area has ever been open as a public road. A search of the records indicate that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "C" Class in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 5. The Department of Public Works considers the remaining subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

Vacation area contains approximately 33,600 square feet.
