## ORDINANCE NO. 0239

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of South 95th Street Petitioner: Delta Marine Industries, Inc. V-1779

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of South 95th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 3. The Department of Public Works notified the various utilities serving the area and was advised that easements are not required.
- 4. The vacation area is a portion of the area acquired by King County by Treasurer's Deed No. 37667 on February 2, 1960 for the sum of \$50.00. This portion of South 95th Street was established as a county road by Order of Establishment (Survey #32-24-4-9B) on February 20, 1961. No evidence was found that the County has ever maintained the area. Right of way would, therefore, be classified "A" Class in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 5. The petitioner has entered into an agreement with the adjoining property owners to obtain the necessary permits for installation of the proper culverts in that area. They have agreed to excavate and install a 72" Diameter Steel Culvert Pipe (Asphalt Coated) in 30 LF Ditch at a cost of \$84,800.00. Thereafter, the property will be properly landscaped in accordance with the finished contours of the land.
- 6. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 20 H day of Security, 1982

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
