ORDINANCE NO. 6267

AN ORDINANCE relating to the annexation of an area known as Island 82-2 to King County Water District #124.

STATEMENT OF FACT:

- 1. A notice of intention proposing the annexation of an area known as Island 82-2 to King County Water District #124 was filed with the County Council effective November 29, 1982.
- 2. King County Water District #124 has found the petition for annexation to be sufficient and has, by Resolution #395 concurred with the proposed annexation.
- 3. King County Water District #124 filed a Declaration of Non-significant Impact dated October 29, 1982, on the proposed annexation.
- 4. The County Council held a public hearing on the <u>17th</u> day of <u>Security</u>, 1982, and has considered the criteria set forth in R.C.W. 57.02.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1 The annexation by King County Water District #124 of the area known as Island 82-2 and described in Section 4 herein is approved. This proposed annexation is consistent with R.C.W. 57.02.040 as described in the attached King County Council Annexation Report on Island 82-2.

SECTION 2. The King County Water District #124 is the appropriate entity to serve the area proposed to be annexed.

SECTION 3 Completion of this annexation does not constitute county approval or disapproval of any other permits, certifications, or actions necessary to provide service to this annexation area.

SECTION 4 The area known as Island 82-2 to be annexed is described as follows:

That portion of the South half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 15, Township 21 North, Range 4 East. W.M., lying Easterly of the centerline of Military Road South; TOGETHER WITH. Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 14, Township 21 North, Range 4 East. W.M.; TOGETHER WITH the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 14.INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 20 H day of December _____, 19<u>82</u>. 1. BUILDING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT DIVISION REPORT:

BALD Recommendation: Approve

Each of these requests are consistent with the district's Comprehensive Water System Plan approved by King County by Ordinance 4175 on April 9 1979. The district is the logical purveyor in each instance. Inclusion of these islands appears to be a logical housekeeping measure.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Size of Parcel: The parcels range from .19 acres to 95 acres in area.

Community Planning Area: Federal Way

Council District: 7 and 8

Existing Zoning and Land Use:

77-1: RS 15000. The five acres is subdivided into several parcels of varying area. Four lots are developed.

77-2: RS 15000. The forty acres is subdivided into several parcels of varying area. Sixteen lots are developed.

77-13: FR-P and SE-P: The fifteen acres is in large parcels with two houses. A significant wetland is identified on a portion of the site in the Sensitive Area map folio.

77-16: RS 7200. The .45 acre parcel is part of a church property and a condominium development.

77-17: RS 7200, RS 9600, RS 15000: The seventy acre request is mostly subdivided and developed with houses. The northern portion is undeveloped and characterized by steep slopes.

77-18: RS 9600. This .19 acre request consists of a portion of the right-of-way of 4th Ave. So.

82-2: SR (15,000) and SE. This ninety-five acre request is subdivided into varying lot sizes and developed with fourteen houses. The majority of land is undeveloped and part of the right-of-way of SR 18.

II. COUNCIL STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE, for reasons stated in B.A.L.D. Division Report.

- 1. In each instance (Ordinances 82-71% through 82-724; "Islands 77-1, 77-2, 77-13, 77-16, 77-17, 77-18, and 82-2") the annexation will enhance future Water District #124 comprehensive planning.
- Each of these annexations is consistent with the statutory boundary review guidelines to "adjust impractical boundaries" and to "prevent abnormally irregular boundaries" (RCW 36.93.180).
- Each of these annexations is contemplated by the District's present comprehensive plan, approved by the Council in 1979.
