AN ORDINANCE concurring with the Recommendation of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner, amending King County Zoning Resolution No. 25789, as amended, by reclassifying certain property upon the application of FRANK M. MARTINSON, ET AL, designated Building and Land Development File No. 234-82-R.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. This Ordinance adopts and incorporates the findings and conclusion of the September 22, 1982 report of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner, filed with the Clerk of the Council on October 7, 1982, on the application of FRANK M.

MARTINSON, ET AL to reclassify certain property described in Building and Land Development File No. 234-82-R, as modified below.

SECTION 2. The subject property is reclassified from RS 7200 to RM 900-P, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Uses on the site shall be limited to those enumerated in King County Code 21.16.020(M), 21.16.020(K), 21.16.020(P), and 21.16.020(Q).
- 2. The applicant will submit plans for approval by the Building and Land Development Division pursuant to KCC 21.46.150-200.
- 3. Approval of any building permit on the site shall be subject to review of ingress and egress by the Department of Public Works. The applicant will comply with whatever recommendations are made by that department.
- 4. 'The applicant shall submit drainage plans for review by the Surface Water Management Division which shall determine what measures are necessary to alleviate drainage problems on the site.

Those conditions, which must be satisfied before this ordinance becomes effective, must be satisfied within one year of Council approval, or all authority granted by this ordinance shall expire and this ordinance shall be of no further force or effect. Upon this ordinance becoming effective, the Building and Land Development Division shall amend the official zoning maps of King County to reflect this action. AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$81,280 to the Enhanced 911 Emergency Telephone System Fund for program expenditures in 1982; and amending a new section.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Enhanced 911 Emergency Telephone System Fund the amount of \$81,280 from a Current Expense Fund loan for expenditures relating to the provision of a County-wide Enhanced 911 Emergency Telephone System.

SECTION 2. Whereas the voters of King County have approved the levy of an excise tax on the use of all telephone access lines for the purpose of paying for the implementation and operation of an enhanced 911 emergency telephone system, as provided in King County Ordinance No. 5680, and it is considered in the best interest of the County to proceed with the project in an expeditious manner, the County Executive and/or his designated representative is hereby authorized to arrange for a Current Expense Fund loan pending the receipt of revenues from the aforementioned excise tax with the loan principal and interest to be paid from the excise tax revenues as soon as sufficient revenues are available.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 5757, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:
