ORDINANCE NO. 6319

AN ORDINANCE relating to the personnel system mandated by Article 5 of the County Charter; amending Ordinance 4324, Section 24(c) and K.C.C. 3.12.230.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 4324, Section 24(c) and K.C.C. 3.12.230 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Holidays. A. The following days are hereby designated as official county holidays:

- January 1, New Year's Day;
- 2. February 12, Lincoln's Birthday;
- 3. Third Monday in February, Washington's Birthday;
- 4. Last Monday in May, Memorial Day;
- 5. July 4, Independence Day;
- . 6. First Monday in September, Labor Day;
 - 7. November 11, Veteran's Day;
 - 8. Thanksgiving day and the day immediately following;
 - 9. December 25, Christmas Day;
- 10. Special or limited holidays as declared by the president or governor, and as approved by the council;
- 11. Such other days in lieu of holidays as the council may determine.
- 12. Employees shall be granted two personal holidays to be administered through the vacation plan. One day shall be granted on the first of October and one day on the first of November.
- B. For holidays falling on a Saturday, the Friday before shall be a paid holiday. For holidays falling on a Sunday, the Monday following shall be a paid holiday.
- C. An employee must be in a pay status on the day prior to and the day following a holiday to be eligible for holiday pay.

 Provided, however, that an employee who has at least five years of county service and who retires at the end of a month the last regularly scheduled working day of which is observed as a holiday,
