- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and reports that the subject right-of-way provides access to seven adjoining homes.

 Additionally, they found that the subject street provides a tie between Dayton Avenue North and Greenwood Aveneue North, and thus facilitates neighborhood circulation for both pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Without such a tie, the cross street interval would be over 2,600 feet. The Division of Building and Land Development recommended that the vacation request be denied.
- 4. The Department of Public Works installed barriers at each end of the vacation area for a six month trial period, with the concurrence of the described adjoining homes. The study period showed no complaints from the neighbors or any emergency agencies.
