INTRODUCED BY AUDREY GRUGER

PROPOSED NO. 83-299ORDINANCE NO. 6454

AN ORDINANCE related to housing and community development; adopting King County's Community Development Block Grant projects and programs for funding provided by the 1983 Federal Emergency Jobs Bill; appropriating \$2,628,000 to the Community Development Block Grant Fund; and amending Ordinance 6213, Section 60, as amended; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

SECTION 1. The King County Council hereby finds that:

A. The Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, hereinafter referred to as the Act, establishes a program of financial assistance to local governments such as King County for the development of viable communities through the provision of decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanded economic opportunities, primarily for persons of low and moderate income;

B. King County has qualified as an eligible urban county applicant for Block Grant funding under the Federal Emergency Jobs Bill amending the Act and is entitled to a grant of approximately \$2,628,000 for 1983;

C. Under the 1983 Federal Emergency Jobs Bill entitlement King County will receive approximately \$1,928,702 (including 5% for Program Administration) and suburban cities will receive approximately \$699,298;

D. King County, through interlocal cooperation agreements, has formed an urban county consortium with twenty-five cities and towns of the county for the purpose of carrying out eligible activities and promoting objectives of the Act;

E. A Joint Policy Committee has been formed under the consortium interlocal cooperation agreements for the purpose of reviewing and recommending approval of Block Grant projects to the King County Council;

F. The King County Council has held public hearings to hear and consider the views of citizens on housing and community development needs;

1 G. The King County Council finds and determines that the projects and
2 programs for which funds will be used have been developed to give maximum
3 feasible priority to activities which will benefit low and moderate income
4 families, to aid in the prevention and elimination of slums and blight, or to
5 meet urgent community development needs;

6 H. The King County Council by Motion 5473 has adopted the King County
7 Community Development Block Grant Consortium Policy Plan for 1983, which
8 establishes specific goals and objectives for community development and uti-
9 lization of Block Grant Funds.

10 SECTION 2. The projects listed in the Attachment to this Ordinance are
11 hereby adopted and approved in the funding categories and amounts therein
12 specified and the County Executive is hereby authorized to submit the approved
13 projects to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development
14 (HUD);

15 Provided that:

16 All projects have or will receive Joint Policy Committee approval in the
17 exact funding categories and amounts listed in the Attachment to this
18 ordinance.

19 SECTION 3. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of
20 \$2,628,000 to the Community Development Block Grant Fund from an increase in
21 entitlement.

22 SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 6213, Section 60, as amended, is hereby amended
23 to read as follows:

24 From the Community Development Block Grant Fund there is hereby appro-
25 priated: ((~~\$15,105,105~~)) \$17,733,015.

26 Provided that:

27 All provisos adopted by the Council in Ordinance No. 6213, as amended,
28 shall be fulfilled.

1 SECTION 5. The County Council finds as a fact and declares that an
2 emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate pre-
3 servation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county
4 government and its existing public institutions.
