ORDINANCE NO. 6479

AN ORDINANCE establishing the date for an election on the question of annexation, zoning and assumption of indebtedness to the City of Tukwila of unincorporated territory contiguous thereto commonly known as "Allentown"; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The City of Tukwila, by Ordinance 1293 has determined that the best interests and general welfare of the City of Tukwila would be served by the annexation of certain unincorporated territory, contiguous thereto, commonly known as "Allentown", and hereinafter described.

SECTION 2. Said Ordinance does satisfy the provisions of RCW 35A.14.020 requesting the calling of an election to be held among the qualified voters therein upon the question of annexation.

SECTION 3. The King County Boundary Review Board by its Resolution and Hearing decision dated January 10, 1980, approved the proposal as submitted, all in accordance with RCW 36.93.100. The decision, appealed to Superior Court (Docket No. 80-2-01283-5) was resolved by Stipulation and Order of Dismissal entered on February 18, 1982.

SECTION 4. A special election shall be held on the 20th day of September, 1983, or at the next special election date as provided by law, within the territory of the proposed annexation, as hereinafter described, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors within the said territory the proposition of annexation, zoning and assumption of indebtedness to the City of Tukwila.

SECTION 5. The boundaries of the territory proposed for annexation are hereby described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Easterly line of State Sign Route No. 99 at its intersection with the thread of the Duwamish River in Section 9, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, Willamette Meridian;

Thence Easterly and Southerly along the thread of the Duwamish River to its intersection with the Easterly margin of 42nd Avenue South, said point of intersection being also the existing city limits;

Thence Easterly along the existing city limits as established by City of Tukwila Annexation Ordinances No's 255, 259, 244, 252 and 494 to the point of intersection of said city limits with the Southwesterly right-of-way line of the Burlington Northern Railroad, said point being on the Northsouth centerline of Section 14, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, W.M.;

Thence Northwesterly along said Southwesterly right-of-way line of the Burlington Northern Railway to its intersection with the Northwesterly margin of Interstate Highway 5;

Thence Northerly and Westerly along said Westerly line of Interstate Highway 5 to the North line of Section 10, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, Willamette Meridian;

Thence Westerly along said North line of Section 10 and continuing Westerly along the North line of Section 9, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, to the Easterly margin of State Sign Route 99 (Pacific Highway South);

Thence Southerly along said Easterly margin of State Sign Route No. 99 to the thread of the Duwamish River and the point of beginning;

Except any portion thereof lying within the northwest quarter of Section 11, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, Willamette Meridian.
