- A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a 1. portion of Campbell Lumber Company Road, hereinafter described.
- The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were not required.
- The Division of Building and Land Development has 3. studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- The vacation area is a portion of a road known as the Campbell Lumber Company Road. It was quit-claimed to King County on December 11, 1926 and recorded in Auditor's File No. 2279626 (Vol. 1341 of Deeds, page 101) by the Campbell Lumber Company. The vacation area appears to have been used years ago for access to the gravel pit area to the south. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "C" Class in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.

Commencing at the Southwest corner of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 6, Township 25 North, Range 6 East, W.M., King County, Washington; thence South 88°53'21" East along the South line of said SE 1/4 a distance of 183.02 feet; thence North 01°25'36" East a distance of 0.55 feet to the TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING: thence North 88°53'21" West a distance of 89.00 feet; thence North 47°50' West a distance of 85.3 feet; thence North 78°51'30" West to an intersection with a line 15 feet Easterly of and parallel with the West line of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4, said point being the terminus of said described line.


